**DEW LINE QUESTIONS**

**St. Laurent Reiterates Canadian Interests Safe**

OTTAWA (CP)—Prime Minister St. Laurent reiterated Wednesday that Canadian sovereignty and opportunities for Canadian contractors to take part are fully provided for in agreements covering construction and operation of the Arctic radar line. His statement was made in the Commons in reply to recent opposition questions about Canadian interests in the DEW (Distant Early Warning) line being built by the United States in Canada's Arctic. Before the prime minister spoke, Leopold Langlois, parliamentary assistant to Transport Minister Marler, said the DEW line agreement provides that Canadian carriers will be given a chance to take part in DEW line transportation "to the fullest extent possible." He added, however, that it "does not provide specifically that Canadian contractors will be given the opportunity to bid or that they will be asked to furnish tenders." **CONTINENTAL DEFENCE** Mr. St. Laurent said he wants to emphasize that the DEW line is for continental — not exclusively Canadian defense. "That being the case, it seems appropriate that the United States as the largest country with the

most at stake, should have the larger share of responsibility. (The U.S. is financing construction of the \$400,000,000 DEW line, whose Canadian section will cost more than \$250,000,000. Canada is building the Mid-Canada radar line to the south along the 55th parallel. He said Canada is satisfied Federal Electric Co. of New Jersey was properly selected as the civilian company which will man the line. It was understood that as far as possible Canadian personnel and goods would be used in the operations. There were another eight Canada-U.S. defence agreements covering other bases in Canada. All stipulated that Canadian and American contractors would be treated on the same basis and in all of them Canadian sovereignty was fully recognized. Mr. St. Laurent also replied that the Canadian red ensign occupies the place of honor on the left side of the stars and stripes at all DEW line bases in Canada.

At the evening service in Sturgeon, the Georgetown Choir led the praise with Easter hymns an anthem and a solo by the organist Harry Vorston.
