Enrollment Figures

Official enrolment figures for the first semester at the University of Prince Edward Island have been released by the Registrar's Office. Enrolment ofr fulltime students stands at 1390, and for part-time and extension students at 763.

These figures show an increase over the 1980-81 academic year when full-time enrolment read 1321, and part-time enrolment was 705.

Full-time enrolment

A breakdown by faculties shows that there are 547 students in the Faculty of Arts; 310 in the Faculty of Science, 76 in the Faculty of Education, and 457 in the Scholl of Business Administration.

A further analysis of the statistics shows 57 students are registered in pre-nursing courses; 89 are studying pre-engineering; and 20 are taking pre-medicene, and 3 pre-architecture courses. There are 713 women and 677 men attending UPEI as full

time students of which 1223 are Island residents. Ninety-eight students are over 25 years of age, and the eldest is 66 years of age.

Part-time and Extension Enrolment

Attending part-time and in extension programmes are 11 students in public administration, and 114 students in business administration. By faculty there are 490 students in the Arts faculty; 55 in Education faculty, 46 in Science

faculty. Fifty-eight students are auditing courses. Women outnumber men with 438 women registered and 325 men.

Students attending part time come from a variety of occupations: teachers, 114; office workers, 214; housewives, 30; students, 101; Centennial Scholars, i.e. Island residents of 60 years of age or older who attend free of charge, 27; nurses, 25. Other categories, 252.

Students range in age from 10 to 83 years.

Meeting for Part-time Students

Part-time and Mature full-time students make up half the university student population yet they seldom have the opportunity to meet and discuss their similar interests and concerns. There is no common meeting place for these students and because they must fit their studies into a schedule that already included job, home, parenting, and community responsibilities, the time spent at the university is limited. The result is that these

students are denied peer interaction and, therefore, the moral support, encouragement, and stimulation open to the traditional student.

A meeting will be held at Robertson Library Lounge on Monday evening, January 18, at 6:30 p.m. to give students the opportunity to discuss issues and ideas and to present problems, concerns, and needs.
