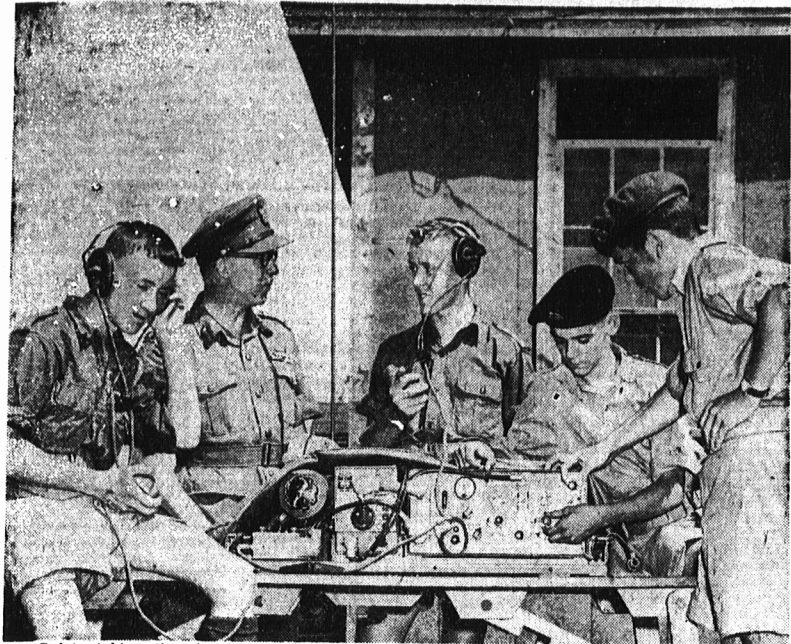


Island Cadets Take Operator's Course

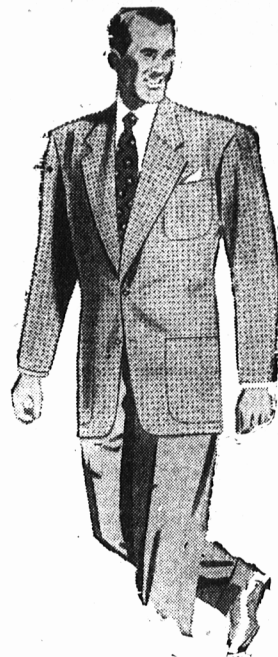

Russia Continues Long Lead In Olympic Games

HELSINKI, July 31 — (CP) — The United States shaved only a thin slice off Russia's lead in the unofficial Olympic point-standing today and now trails by 58 1-2 points.

The totals for the leaders to-night stood: Russia, 523 1-2; United States, 465.

A fifth-place finish in a women's swimming final gave the United States two points. There were no Russian girls in the final. Only other finals decided today were three cycling events, and neither of the two leading countries had anybody in them.

Australia made the biggest point gain of the day—25, with two firsts and a second in cycling — but couldn't climb out of 12th place in the standing.

Olympic officials do not recognize any team-points system, but by custom first place has been rated 10 points with the next five places on a 5-4-3-2-1 basis.

Al Weill Quits Post With I.B.C.

NEW YORK, July 31 — (AP) — Al Weill resigned today as matchmaker for the International Boxing Club and said he hoped to resume management of Rocky Marciano, contender for the world heavyweight title.

Weill has been matchmaker for I. B. C. for three years. During that time Marciano was managed by Marty Weill, Al's son.

The announcement was made following conferences between Al, Jim Norris, president of I.B.C., and Robert Christenberry, chairman of the New York Athletic Commission. The New York Commission ruled that a matchmaker may not manage a fighter.

Al Weill managed Marciano in the early stages of his career and then turned him over to his son when he became matchmaker. Al said he would apply for a manager's licence in New York as soon as possible after Sept. 1. Marciano, who knocked out Harry Matthews of Seattle in the second round Monday night, is the likely opponent for heavyweight champion Jersey Joe Walcott in late September.

Draw Made For Canada-Mexico Davis Cup Play

MONTREAL, July 31 — (CP) — The draw was made today for Canada-Mexico Davis Cup tennis play starting tomorrow and the results couldn't have been better from the spectators' point of view.

Lorne Main of Vancouver will meet Pedro Vega, Mexican playing captain, in the first match of afternoon games, which begin at 2 p.m. EDT, and Brendan Macken of Montreal meets Mario Llamas in the second.

The first match could be close, with Main's two-handed shots causing Vega trouble. Llamas and Manuel Galeana, the third member of the Mexican team, are scheduled to play doubles Saturday. The Canadian team has not yet been named, but it is possible that Macken and Main will handle that chore, too. The winner of the matches here meets the winner of the United States-Cuba tie being played this week-end. That series will begin Aug. 8.
