Contract Let For Street Work In Montague

Poole and Beer Construction Company, Montague, was granted the contract to grade and gravel the streets of Montague at a special meeting of the Town Council last night. His Worship, Mayor B. H. Yeo presided. Present were Councillors Hessian, Reynolds, Jamieson and McGowan. Mr. Austin Fraser was present to represent the construction company.

The motion was moved by Councillor Reynolds and seconded by Councillor Jamieson that the contract of \$1.25 per yard be accepted up to 2400 yards as set out in the letter from the company, and the council further empowered the company to clear drains and obstructions so as to make and complete the streets in a proper and satisfactory manner. All employees are to be hired by the company. According to the estimate submitted, approximately 2-3-4 miles of work will be done on the north side of the town and approximately 1/2 mile on the south side. It is expected that the work of grading and preparing the streets for graveling will get under way immediately.

Considerable discussion took place regarding the dredging of the dock east of the Stevens wharf. This received the wholehearted support of the Councillors, and the Clerk was instructed to write Mr. H. E. Millar, district engineer. It is proposed that this work might be accomplished while the Dredge 115 is at present working at Montague. Should this work be done, the fisherman will be supplied with an excellent boat harbor from which they may base fishing operations.
