4.2 per cent of the cattle, through the percentage varied considerably in the different provinces. Setting up brucellosis free areas on a similar basis to that followed in the T.B. free area program is a logical step in the eradication of brucellosis.

An area testing program was started in Denmark in 1946. At that time 25 per cent of the herds contained brucellosis infected cattle. By 1954 the infected herds had been reduced to 2 per cent and 1957 has been set as a goal for eradication of the disease from all herds. In the United States, an important market for Canadian cattle, the level of infection was estimated at 11.5 per cent in 1935. This was reduced to 2 per cent by 1939, following the testing of 33 million cattle. During the years 1935 to 1954, \$193 million of public funds was spent on brucellosis eradication. Today, seven states and over 60 countries have been declared modified certified areas. Eradication programs are under way in nearly every state of the Union, and the work is being speeded up in the hope of having the entire country declared a modified certified area for brucellosis control by 1960.

**P.E.I. TAKES LEAD**

One year and a half ago the blood testing of all cattle started in Prince Edward Island. This Province was the first in Canada to commence an eradication program for brucellosis. When the province wide blood test is completed within a few weeks this will be the first province or state in North America to be considered a Brucellosis free listed area. As stated before millions of dollars are being spent in other areas to accomplish this enviable position. The price which we must be prepared to pay in order to maintain our favored position is one of the constant vigilance. Don't import infection. When animals are purchased outside the province make sure they come from a clean herd. Insist that they be blood tested and are negative and are from negative herds.

**CALFHOOD VACCINATION**

In October 1951 Prince Edward Island entered into the Federal programme. The meaning of this programme is that calves vaccinated in the stipulated age groups would be considered as officially vaccinated. During the last six years repeated appeals have been made by your Veterinary Division to vaccinate your calves. However, the response has been very very small.

If the livestock breeders of this province are ever going to enjoy an export trade in cattle it will be necessary to have your animals officially vaccinated. If this export trade is going to be with the United States then the animals must have been vaccinated sometime during the sixth, seventh, or eighth month of age. The recent extension of the vaccination age by the Veterinary Director General is we understand chiefly to assist the western livestock men who can only vaccinate once a year at round up time.

As Director of Veterinary Services for this Province, I feel that calves in this province should be vaccinated either in the sixth, seventh or eighth month of age.

**HOW TO VACCINATE**

When a breeder has calves reaching six months of age he should notify his District Veterinarian as to the number of calves to be vaccinated and their age. The veterinarian will vaccinate these calves when he is in the district. The cost is only seventy cents per calf. The remainder is paid for by the Provincial Department of Agriculture. The Canada Department of Agriculture supplies the vaccine.

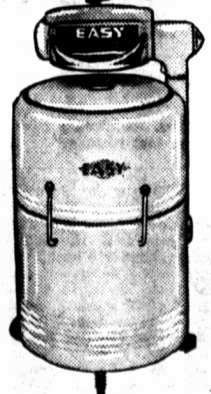

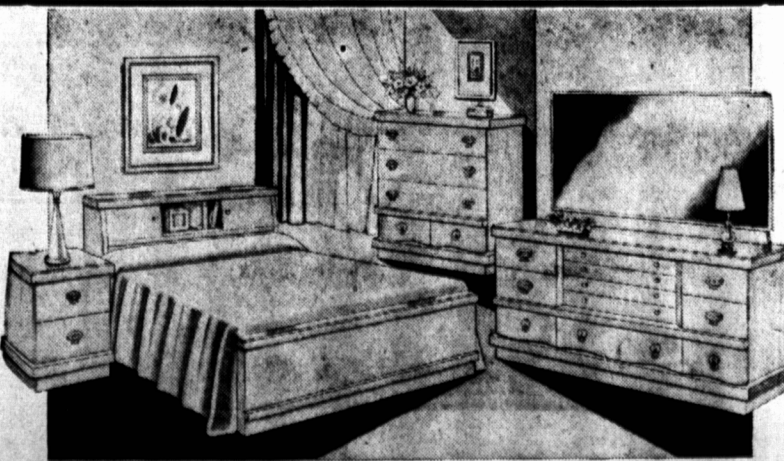

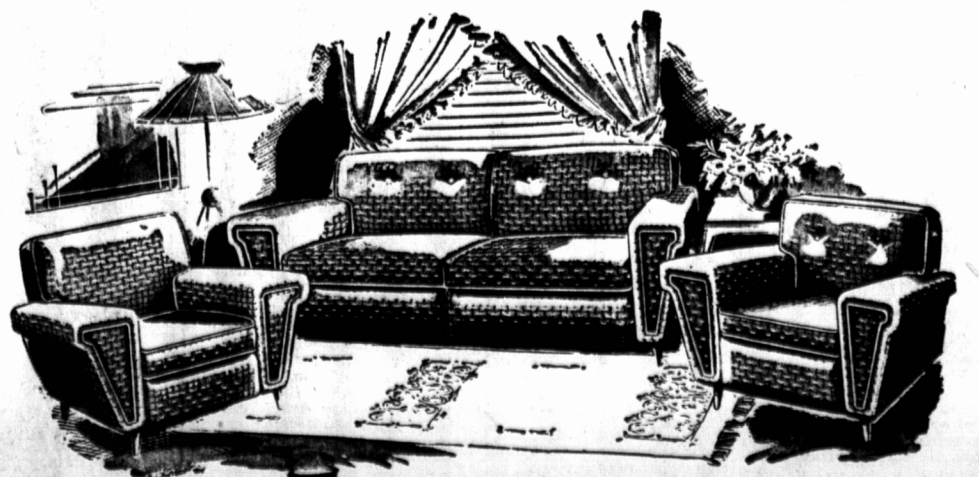
