CONVENT OF NOTRE DAME

Brilliant Commencement Exercises --Winners of Medals.

The commencement exercises of the Convent of Notre Dame were held last evening, and were of an especially brilliant character. The programme, which was an exceptionally good one, was rendered in a most acceptable manner; and every one present was delighted. The vocal and instrumental music was rendered with much skill and expression, sustaining the reputation of the convent in this regard. The numbers by the children of the Kindergarten were decidedly pleasing features, "Sadie's Secret," provoking considerable laughter. The action song, "The Chinese Umbrella," by the junior pupils was also good, the singing and acting throughout being highly creditable to the little ones participating. The senior pupils, distinguished themselves in the "Scarf Fantastic," the "Breton Sailor," and a pleasing allegory entitled "The Choice," the characters in which were cleverly taken by Mesdames Margaret Walsh, Alice Trainor, Gertrude Macdonald, Marie Larkin and Ida Byrne. The "Scarf Fantastic" was new to Charlottetown audiences, and the various movements evoked frequent applause. The tableau at the close of the allegory was one of the prettiest stage pictures that has come under our notice. After the tableau medals and crosses were awarded as follows:—

Gold medal for application, equally merited by Mesdames Nellie Morgan and Beatrice McDonald, awarded to Miss Beatrice McDonald.

Gold cross presented by Rev. Father McLean, awarded to Miss Alice Trainor for Christian Doctrine.

Gold cross presented by Mr. William Murray for general proficiency in the third grade of the senior department, awarded to Miss Gertrude McDonald.

Prize for fancy work, presented by a friend, equally merited by Mesdames Eugenie Hornsby, Addie Hogan, Yvonne Sheehy; drawn by Miss Eugenie Hornsby.

Prize for Botany presented by Mr. John Clarkin, awarded to Miss Eulalie McDonald.

Prize for general satisfaction in the intermediate department awarded to Miss Marion Doyle.

A feature of the proceedings was the presentation of an address to Lieutenant Governor McIntyre, which His Honor acknowledged in fitting terms. Addresses were delivered by His Lordship Bishop McDonald, Dr. Anderson, of Prince of Wales College, and ex-Councillor Byrne, all of whom spoke in terms of praise of the excellent entertainment provided. In connection with the distribution of prizes the Sisters of the convent acknowledged the generosity of Mrs. Maurice Blake, Mrs. Hornsby, Dr. Murray and others. The singing of the National Anthem brought the proceedings to a close.
