## Junior Canadiens At Halifax

The Ontario Hockey Association league leading Montreal Junior Canadiens will play an All-Star Maritime League team at the Halifax Forum, Monday night, 8:30 p.m.

On defence will be "Top Top" Gallant, Summerside, Ontario, Alberta, and Fred, and the Halifax team will be playing nets. A press release from Halifax yesterday said that the Maritime team will be a combination of players from the Summerside Junior Legionaires, but manager Joe Clark said last night that no players on his team have ever responded to play.
