

**Operation
Cosmetic
Launched**

OTTAWA (CP)—The centennial commission has launched a group of planners on "operation cosmetic."
It is to be a community improvement and rural beautification project, with participation from a cross-section of the Canadian people.
Centennial Commissioner John Fisher, launching the project, said "operation cosmetic" can be among the most significant and important of centennial projects if there is co-operation from across the country.
Object of the plan is to clean up lake and river fronts and the approaches to towns and villages, and to clean, paint and brighten up streets, roadways and buildings.
"We shall be making for a better Canada and a better Canadian way of life, not only for the centennial year, but for the years and decades following our birthday celebrations in 1967," Mr. Fisher said.
Among those participating were representatives of the Canadian Chamber of Commerce, the Canadian Tourist Association, the Federation of Mayors and Municipalities, the Canadian Federation of Agriculture and the Federated Women's Institutes of Canada.
Also present were representatives of the Canadian Paint, Varnish and Lacquer Association, the Canadian Forestry Association, the 4-H Clubs, and the Quebec department of municipal affairs.
