Hence the announcement that Sir Wilfrid's welcome home is to be public but non-political.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL

LONDON, July 17.—Reports from Kimberley, Cape Town, are to the effect that several Europeans and 50 natives were entombed as the result of an accident at the Debeers mines last night. Twenty natives were rescued. There is little hope of rescuing the others.

SEATTLE, Washington, July 18.—The excitement over the Klondyke mines is on the increase and hundreds of people are preparing to sail for Alaska. The steamer Portland, which brought down over \$1,000,000 in gold, on her return trip, will be crowded to her utmost capacity.

CONSTANTINOPLE, July 20.—The ambassadors have informed the Porte that they wish a written declaration as to the intention of the Turkish Government which have hitherto been communicated orally by Tewnk Pasha, and have stated that if this is not forthcoming they will suspend the negotiations and refer the whole matter to their respective governments with a view of adopting coercive measures.

LONDON, July 18.—T. P. O'Connor, in referring to the Sun's comment upon the statements of Secretary of the State Sherman in connection with the Behring Sea sealing controversy; "The despatch is a useful reminder to the rules of this country and the world that all is not peace and friendship to England. These bickerings will recur until the Irish question is settled. The chief cause of the friction in England is the industrial portion of America's population removed from Great Britain."

LONDON, July 17.—This week England has seen the first really hot weather of the year. In London there has been several sunstrokes, and a good many horses have died from the heat. Straw hats have appeared again on all sides, and everywhere one hears the complaint that the weather is worse than that of the tropics, although the mercury has not yet gone above 75. Visiting Americans are luxuriating in the temperature and are praising London as a summer resort, greatly to the astonishment of the resident Londoners.

OTTAWA, July 19.—The shrill notes of a siren blowing by compressed air will next summer guide steamships through the Straits of Belleisle in foggy weather. Such at least are the plans which Col. Anderson, chief engineer of the marine department, has well under way. Should they prove successful the scheme will be an innovation in more ways than one. Not only is the use of compressed air instead of steam a novelty in itself, but the chief engineer proposes to generate this pneumatic force in a way that is quite original in marine practice. Instead of the usual steam boiler the force for compressing will be furnished by a jet wheel driven by a water power with a fall of 125 feet.

The compressed air will be driven in pipes a distance of 2,450 feet to the top of an eminence on which the lighthouse and signal station are situated. As the straits are only navigable during the late spring and summer, the water power will be easily available for the entire period during which the signal will be of service to the passing steamers. The special advantage of this pneumatic-hydraulic device is its simplicity and safety. One of the most fruitful sources of accident to the signal apparatus is the explosion of steam boilers. The architect of the light house branch of the department left today by steamer Aberdeen from Quebec, to superintend the erection of the buildings and the machinery which will be of the very best, will be supplied by the British light house board in time for installation next autumn.
