Strawberry Planting

KENTVILLE, N.S. — Poor planting practices account for most losses in new strawberry plantings in the Maritime provinces.

That's the opinion of C. L. Lockhart and Alan MacNab, plant pathologists with the federal and the Nova Scotia departments of agriculture. They say further losses are caused by stem borers, green petal virus, high soluble salts (due to over-fertilization in dry weather), storage mold, and planting winter-killed plants. So there are plenty of do's and don'ts.

Here are some of their suggestions: Don't plant where strawberries have been grown within the last five years; nor where peas, tomatoes and potatoes have been grown recently, because some soil-borne diseases of these crops also attack strawberries.

High yields begin with top quality plants so buy certified "disease-free" nursery stock.

Plants should be set out early in the spring. They should be planted soon after delivery. Do not let them "dry out" during planting. Plant them at the right depth, with the soil midway up the crown - too shallow planting will result in drying out and too deep in smothering.

PAINTING UNDER PORCH
QUESTION: Someone told me that when I repaint my wood porch floor I should also paint the underside, as a protection against decay caused by rising ground dampness. Is this right? It's a lot more work.

ANSWER: Your informant is absolutely right. I suggest your using aluminum paint for this under-cover. It makes an excellent vapor barrier. To increase protection, cover the ground area with overlapping layers of heavy plastic sheeting. Either cement the laps together or weigh them down with rocks.

HIGHLIGHTING FURNITURE
QUESTION: I have several pieces of bedroom furniture that need repainting badly. Is there any easy way to get the antique effect of gold highlights on the surface?

ANSWER: Kits for repainting furniture in antique gold are available in various sizes (depending upon the number of pieces to be refinished) at some large paint and housewares dealers. Follow the manufacturer's instructions.

RUST ON GLASS
QUESTION: My aluminum screens are making my windows rusty. How would you get the rust off the glass? I've used almost everything with no results.

ANSWER: Have you tried carefully rubbing the rusted area of glass with fine steel wool and applying the rust-removing preparation available at most hardware and variety stores?

BRICKS GETTING POWDERY
QUESTION: The bricks in our basement wall are getting powdery. Is there anything that can be done to stop it?

ANSWER: Try applying a liquid cement-hardening preparation, available masonry supplies dealers and some large hardware stores. If the bricks are very old and deteriorating replacement may be the only correction.

PRIVACY PLUS DAYLIGHT
QUESTION: The dining room window in our ground-level apartment faces a sidewalk, just outside the window, where people pass by and look in. The window is large, almost floor-ceiling height, and is paneled (20 of them) I have covered the panes with white tissue paper which permits daylight through and gives privacy; also, tried Japanese rice paper with impregnated leaves and butterflies but it looked too busy. Can you suggest some product, perhaps a spray, which would provide privacy without sacrificing daylight?

ANSWER: A "frosting" type paint, in aerosol form, is available at some large paint and housewares stores. How about using window curtains of unlined curtain fabric, such as fiber glass? In a wide variety of weaves and colors at department and fabric stores; very easy to launder, too.

LEAKY GUTTER
QUESTION: My roof gutters seemed to take quite a punishment last winter. Now they leak in quite a few places. Not being "loaded" at the moment, is there any inexpensive way to patch them? New ones are out of reach.

ANSWER: First spread black plastic roofing cement as a liner. Then press heavy aluminum foil into the cement, shaping it to the gutter's curve. Finally, cover the foil with another layer of the cement. In effect sandwiching the foil between coats of cement. This should last you for quite a while. I know of one such which was still going strong three years later, when the owner finally decided to replace with new gutters.

PAINTING LEATHERETTE
QUESTION: I have a set of dining room chairs covered with a plastic leatherette. Is there a paint that would cover and stick to this type of surface without cracking?

ANSWER: Yes, vinyl plastic sprays, in a variety of colors, are available at many paint and large housewares dealers. Follow label directions for use carefully.

RELUCTANT DRAINAGE
QUESTION: How can I speed up reluctant drainage in my kitchen sink?

ANSWER: Unscrew the plug covering the bottom of the trap underneath. Then, with a bent, stiff piece of wire, scrape out all the accumulation you can reach. If drainage is still slow after this, use drain-cleaning preparation. Call a good plumber, if results are still negative.
