Rail Workers Compensation To Be Pondered

OTTAWA (CP) — Compensation for displaced railway personnel will be referred to a parliamentary committee after the Christmas recess, Transport Minister Balcer said here.

He replied to the fifth consecutive request on the subject by the national legislative committee of the International Railway Brotherhoods, making its annual submission to cabinet.

The brief notes that the organization, comprising the running railway trades, has sought recognition for the last five years without success.

"We only wish to stress the urgency of the matter at this time," it said, noting that the royal commission on transportation "practically endorsed the abandonment of many thousands of miles of railway."

It said CN president Donald Gordon was quoted as saying that some 1,400 employees would be laid off if the company were required to move because of railway renovations and line abandonments should be compensated, particularly since such moves often depreciate the value of houses owned by employees.

TO REVIEW RECORD WASHINGTON (AP) — President Kennedy will appear on U.S. television networks Monday night to review his first two years in the White House. The four-hour program will be taped in advance and shown at 8:30 p.m. EST by ABC and CBS and at 8:30 p.m. by NBC.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

QUIZ

You are South, neither side vulnerable. The bidding has been:

East South West North Pass Pass Pass 1 ♠

What would you now bid with each of the following four hands?

- 1. ♠Q852 ♥A7842 ♦73 ♠K5
2. ♠K1083 ♥Q765 ♦98642
3. ♠K6 ♠K52 ♦A964 AK53
4. ♠K84 ♥72 ♦A7852 A6

1. Three spades. Responses by a player who has passed originally are interpreted in a different light from those made by a player who has not previously passed. For example, the three spade bid recommended here is not forcing and partner is permitted to pass. Similarly, a two heart response would not be forcing. In both cases partner would be required to bid again except for the previous bid.

The reason such bids are non-forcing is logical enough. If your partner opens the bidding third or fourth hand and you've passed, he is in a good position to know whether or not a game is possible with his hand. If his judgment indicates that game cannot be made even though you jump the bid, he is under no obligation to bid again.

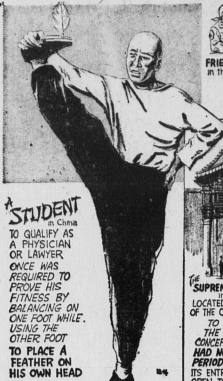

2. Pass. There's no use looking for trouble. The chance of making game is remote, and the chance of improving matters by looking for a better trump suit is more imaginary than real. It's best to let well enough alone.
3. Three e notrump. You'll never be able to convince partner you passed this 13-point hand if you respond with 1 w notrump, which is not forcing under the circumstances. Perhaps you shouldn't have passed originally, but it was difficult to find a satisfactory opening bid. However, this merely lends force to the argument for a three notrump response. There's only one way to compensate for the earlier pass, and that's by bidding game.
4. Four spades. You might have opened the bidding with this hand also, but that's a debatable proposition. Having decided to pass, you make up for it by bidding a game.
