Boiler Break Causes Damage At Stores



A break in the boiler of the hot water heating system at Woolworth's in Summerside sometime during Wednesday night or early Thursday morning flooded the basement storage of that firm and the adjoining storage basement of the Co-op Super Market, causing damage to merchandise in both places. Damage to the Co-op's merchandise was in excess of two hundred dollars while the damage to stock in Woolworth's basement may run to upwards of twice that amount. The water covered the basement floor to a depth of about three or four inches and then flowed out underneath the entrance doors at the back of the stores. Fortunately most of the merchandise in both basements was on raised platforms that just cleared the water level, or the damage would have been very costly. Wearing rubber boots and using brooms, shovels, and a sump pump, three men are seen at work draining out the water and cleaning up the floating debris in Woolworth's basement. (Photo by Wotton).

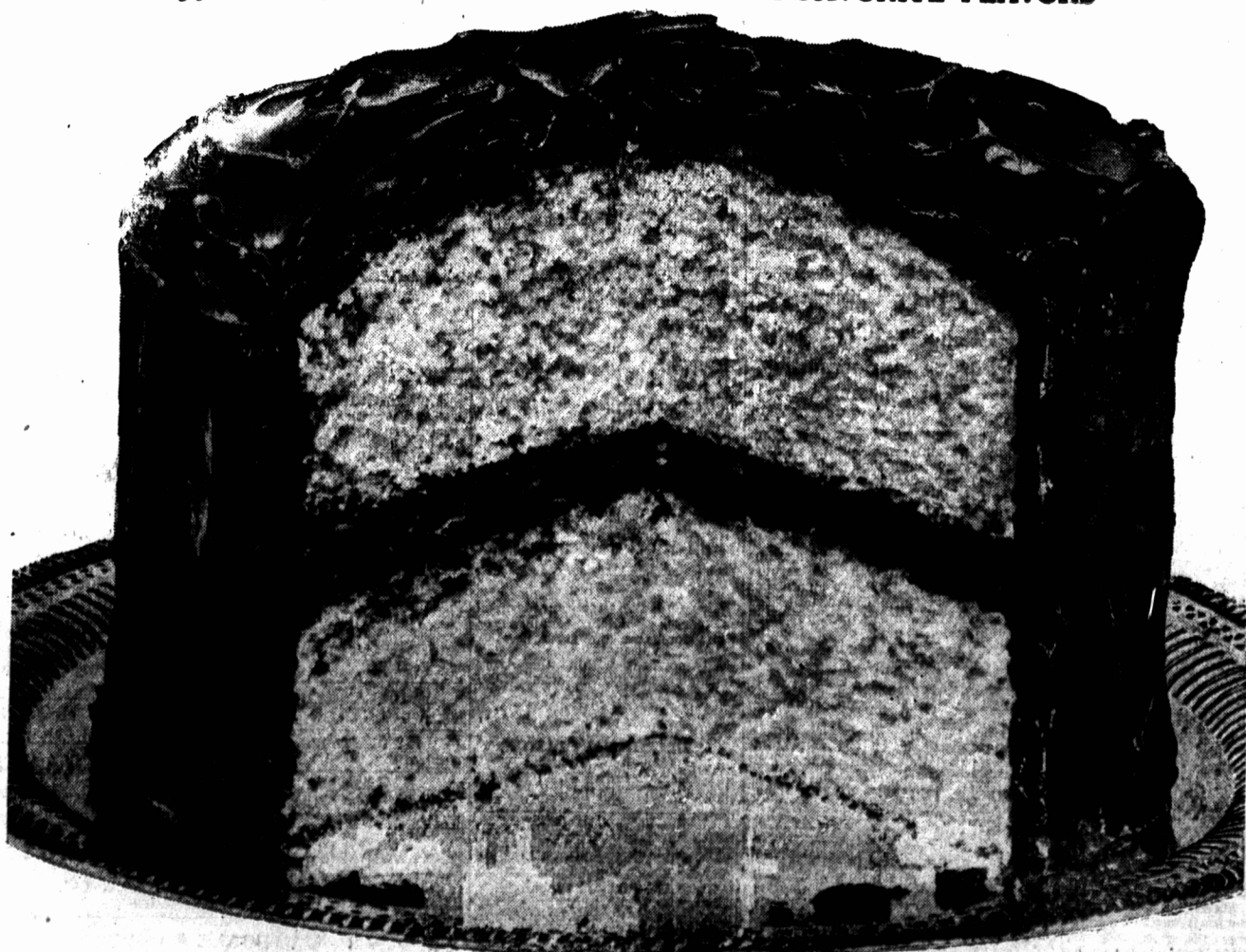
