was continued for four weeks. What were the results obtained by this simple treatment? Follow-up studies were possible in 31 cases of furunculosis and 24 cases of sycoosis. The results were considered good provided the infection was removed from where it started, the nose. In 10 cases of boils with heavy nose infection, the boils disappeared in 9. Of six patients with boils which did not clear-up completely, 3 had a good result, in 2 the infection returned, and in one treatment was a failure. Of 11 patients with sycoosis and heavy nose infection, all had a good result. One patient was not cured.

The use of new drugs in old procedure and then plunging a toothpick into center of boil and thus allowed the pus to pour out. The toothpick had been dipped into carbolic acid.
