C. N. R. Parking Lot Planned
MONCTON — To provide better facilities for the road transport vehicles operated by Canadian National Railways on Prince Edward Island, work is to start soon on the construction of a new parking lot on the site of the old roundhouse at C'town, C.C. Gillespie, superintendent of road transport, said Thursday.

Mr. Gillespie said that the project will be carried out by the C.N.R.'s Engineering Department and will consist of preparing the ground by bulldozing and leveling, the provision of suitable fill material and the erection of a modern steel mesh fence around the entire area. Facilities will be provided for storage of all the Canadian National road transport vehicles used on the Island, including those operated by C.N. Express.

Seamen's Strike Ties Up Ships
MONTREAL (CP)—A seamen strike to back wage demands tied up three Canadian National Steamships vessels Thursday and another five were scheduled to suffer the same fate when they reach Canadian ports.

The Seafarers' International Union (SIU) made good its decision to call out the first of nearly 300 seamen at 1 p.m. ADT Thursday. Two vessels were affected here and one at Halifax.

A fourth was due to reach Halifax today. The remainder will put in here or at Saint John, N.B., after returning from Caribbean runs.

It was a peaceful development in Montreal's waterfront.

The Canadian Highlander and the Canadian Challenger of the government-owned CNS were shifted to mid-stream in the morning after unloading. The crews were taken off by tender and picketing by three SIU-owned craft followed.
