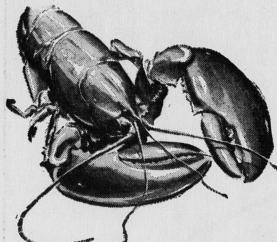

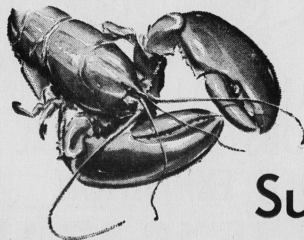

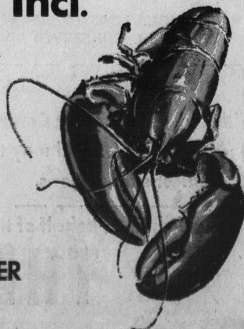

## Great Race Cards Going At S'side

One of the more exciting and spectacular events during Lobster Carnival Week in Summerside, July 13-18 will be nightly harness racing at the local raceway.

An eight dash card is scheduled nightly with post time set for 8:30 p.m. with the exception of Saturday. That afternoon a six dash card is slated with starting time at 3:00 p.m. following the thrilling and colorful spectacle of the RCMP Musical Ride at 2:18. Thursday evening will feature another six dash card with the colorful mounties again performing for the crowd.

A two dash race that fans won't want to miss is the no deductions, 3000 Invitational Pace on Friday evening. Many teams and drivers from the mainland are expected to compete. The

horses, among several are Dee's Boy, owned by Boland's of Halifax and reined by Myron MacArthur; Dominion Bred owned by Doug Hill of Charlottetown and driven by Joe Hennessey; either Watch Top or Port Wallace Bay owned by Dan Myers and to be driven by Art Fifee and Crash 30 owned and driven by James Gibbon. ## Bands Plentiful For Big Carnival

Musical entertainment for this year's lobster carnival here will be the best in the history of the town.

Bands from as far away as Vancouver and as close as Summerside itself will provide musical enjoyment in the form of concerts during the week-long festivities.

Currently on a dominion wide tour, the Vancouver Junior Band will be arriving here on Thursday of Carnival Week and will perform Thursday evening and Friday afternoon.

On Friday the 56-piece band, under the direction of Gordon Olson, will march from the CNR station to Civic Auditorium where they will give a demonstration.

This group of youngsters, 56 in all, is currently in Sydney, Nova Scotia, on a lengthy tour and will officially represent Vancouver at the New York World Fair.

The band has been supplying most of the half-time entertainment for the home games of the B.C. Lions in the Western Division of the Canadian Football conference and in their colorful uniforms, have been rated among the best entertainment anywhere.

Their uniforms are an authentic copy of that worn by the beekeepers who guard the Tower of London, replete with heraldic trumpets, banners and the

drum majorettes in jester's costumes.

Other mainland bands providing entertainment during the carnival will be the Oromoco Lions Club band which visitors and residents enjoyed so much last year.

From Nova Scotia will be the Halifax Artillery Band which will provide the music for the RCMP Musical Ride Friday afternoon and evening. They will also give one concert Friday morning at 10 o'clock.

From Ottawia will be the nationally known RCAF Central Band. This large group will arrive here Sunday afternoon at 2:15 p.m. and is slated to give a concert at Memorial Park between 3 and 4:30 p.m. In the event of rain the concert will be held at the Summerside High School auditorium.

A number of other bands will participate in the week's activities and the following will march in the mammoth parade slated for 1:30 Monday afternoon: Sea Cadet, Salvation Army, Queen Charlotte High School, RECCO Band, Burke's Lofts and Lassie, Fraser's Lovat Band, all of Charlottetown, along with the Miscouche Band and the Air Cadet band of Summerside.

All in all this promises to be the most musical week in the history of the western capital.

## Livestock Show Is Greatest Yet

"1964 looks to be the biggest year yet for the livestock show at the Summerside Lobster Carnival" chairman of the livestock show committee Graeme Linklater said recently.

"Entries for this year's show are up more than 50 over last year's" he said. This year the horse show promises to be a favorite with all, as 28 heavy horses, 19 colts and 38 ponies are entered in the competition.

The horse show will be on Tuesday July 14th and will be judged by George Kitson of Hampshire. Mr. Kitson judged the horses last year, and is well known for his judging ability. Judging starts at one o'clock and the rules state that all animals entered must be in position by noon. All animals must remain until five o'clock.

Harold Heartz, of the Livestock division of the Canada Department of Agriculture, will again judge the sheep classes. He will be assisted by Almond Bonwell. Both men are from Charlottetown and judged the event last year.

The sheep judging will also take place on Tuesday afternoon and again, all animals must be in place by noon. Some 75 sheep are entered this year.

The showing of cattle will take place on Saturday night and begins at 10 o'clock. Again, all animals must be in place one hour before judging. Animals must remain until 8:30 p.m.

### JUDGES SELECTED

Judges for most of the cattle classes have been selected, and they are: Holslein, Ira Lewis, York; Ayneslie, George Boswell, Frenchfort; Jersey - Gernsey, L. W. Roper, Dept. of Agriculture, Charlottetown; Dual purpose shorthorn, Dan Jewell, North River; and the judge for the Aberdeen - Angus class hasn't been announced.

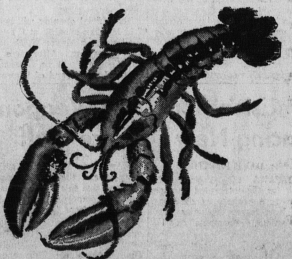
