Local and Other Items.

FOR GOOD ROADS.—A bye-law to raise \$150,000 by debentures for the purpose of building good roads on many of the streets of Hamilton, Ont., was voted on Thursday by the ratepayers and defeated by 111 majority.

CHI DREN'S AWFUL CRIME.—Word comes from Rapid city, Dakota, that little Lena Bouts, fourteen years old, and her brother, Nicholas, ten years old, are under arrest charged with the murder of Frank Bouts, their father. Bouts was a Burlington and Missouri river railroad contractor. The little girl admits the crime, and the boy adds that he did what he could to kill the father. The father is said to have been cruel to his family, and this appears to have been the motive of the crime. The boy steadied a rifle while the little girl pulled the trigger.

Summerside Journal: "In nothing, perhaps, have they shown their unfairness more than in their gerrymander schemes. In Ontario, under the administration of Mowatt, there was a redistribution of constituencies that was simple infamous, and in Prince Edward Island, under the regime of Hon. F. Peters, there was a gerrymander in King's County that provoked general laughter and indignation.
