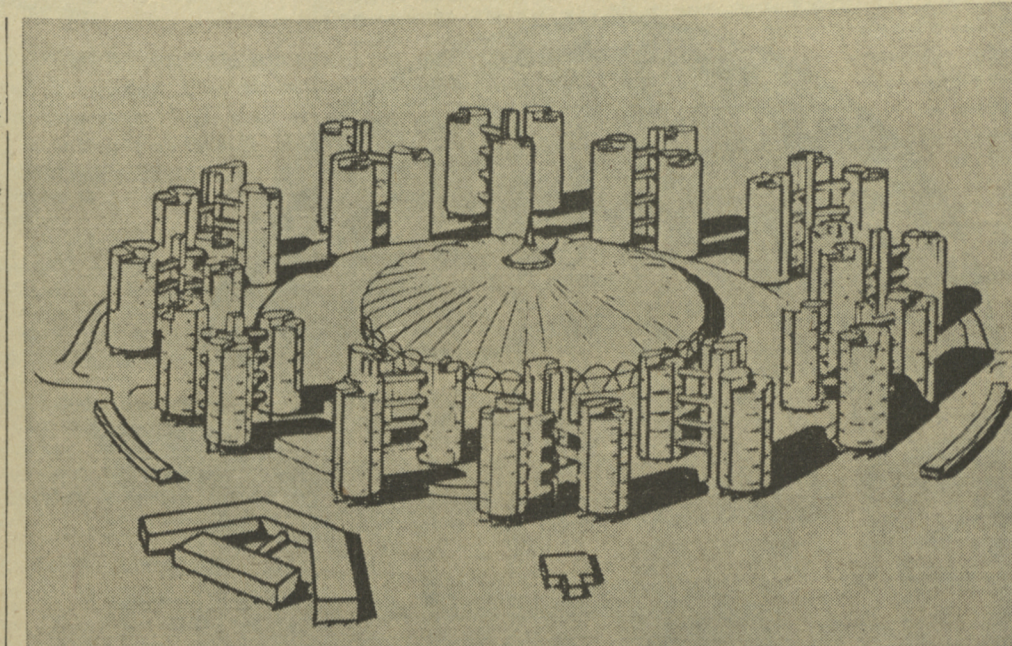

DOME CENTRE OF ARCTIC CITY

Thirty-six 12-storey apartment buildings form a ring around a domed town centre in this architect's sketch of a proposed development for the Eastern Arctic community of Frobisher Bay. The plan, as sketched by the public works department, would have a nuclear heating plant provide the amenities of urban living to several thousand persons. Apartment towers would connect to the dome, covering a post office, banks, schools, swimming pool and parks. Dome would be a thin shell concrete vaulting, with ribs radiating from a central pier. Northern affairs and public works officials emphasize that the plans so far are tentative. Frobisher Bay is expected to become a major air base for northern air routes and the federal government would like to develop it into the administrative centre of the Eastern Arctic. (CP Photo)

Businessmen Leave Today To Seek Markets In North

By SANDY CAMPBELL Canadian Press Staff Writer MONCTON (CP) — Twenty-two Maritime businessmen take off from here today on a three-day junket into the eastern sub-Arctic to drum up markets for Maritime products.

Sponsored by Maritime Central Airways, the tour will take the businessmen to Frobisher Bay, N.W.T., and Goose Bay, Labrador. They will seek a bigger slice of mushrooming northern markets and MCA hopes to benefit from its exclusive freight and passenger franchise in the area.

The Goose Bay area has a population of about 20,000. Backbone of the economy is the big United States and Canadian air force base. Last year the U.S. government spent about \$3,000,000 in the Maritimes, mostly for supplies for Goose Bay. The rest was for material for the USAF base at Stephenville, Nfld.

1958 SALES HIGHER King Fords, cargo supervisor for MCA, said Tuesday the 1958 sale total is expected to exceed last year's but he would not venture a guess on the size of the increase.

He said major reasons for the rise are a visit of Maritime producers to Goose Bay last year sponsored by the Atlantic provinces Economic Council and APECC's Atlantic food show here last April.

Mr. Fords described Frobisher Bay as the coming metropolis of the north. Twelve hundred miles north of Moncton and just 200 miles on the sunny side of the Arctic Circle, the community of about 500 has been called the Arctic crossroads of the world.

Many international airlines stop at Frobisher Bay on their over-the-pole flights from the west coast of North America to Europe.
