At the present, an important question is - What will I grow to get the largest amount of feed per acre? And, how much will this feed cost? During the last 10 years there has been an increasing number of farmers looking for the answer...

There are several reasons why corn has grown in popularity. With the extensive research work, many of the major problems facing farmers growing corn has been overcome. Corn varieties have been developed to mature much faster than the old varieties...

Financing is a major problem. The Farm Credit Corporation has a relatively new plan. It is called the Farm Machinery Syndicate Loan whereby three or more farmers form an association or cooperate to purchase and use machinery...

When selecting corn silage varieties this season, select only those with a maturity range from 80-90 days. The early varieties that are recommended this year include Pride 5, Haasala H175, De Kalb 29, Jacques 8505, Warwick 263 and United 108.

Corn can't be grown on all of our island soils. It requires a well drained field which is the very first requirement. Soil which is slow to dry in the spring is not recommended. It is also a big advantage if it can be kept on higher soils so that there will be a better chance of avoiding late spring and early fall frosts.

In the Charlottetown area corn should be planted usually in the second week of May. This will, of course, depend on the season. Since the growing point of corn does not get above the soil level until at least two weeks after the corn emerges, it can be frosted and not killed.

If a frost strikes after the growing point has emerged it will be killed. For information relating to any phase of corn production, please contact the writer at P.E.I. Department of Agriculture, Charlottetown.
