## New Constitution Only Cure, Biculturalism Probe Told

RIMOUSKI, Que. (CP)—Canada's constitution must be reformed if the country's two main ethnic groups are to live on a footing of equality, the royal commission on bilingualism and biculturalism was told here.

Many of the 125 community leaders who attended a commission hearing in Rimouski, 170 miles northeast of Quebec City, expressed this opinion.

They said the constitution has led to the establishment of a centralizing regime in Ottawa. A new agreement between Canada's French and English-speaking residents was urged.

Others espoused outright separatism. They said Quebec should become an independent

republic because it is no longer worth the province's effort to remain within Confederation. Some felt relations could be improved if Canada got rid of all its ties with the British monarchy and still others thought the key was better treatment for French-speaking minorities outside Quebec.

**CITY PROBLEM**  
At a plenary session that followed the closed, private talks, reporter Lisette Morin of Rimouski said Quebec's main problem is its defensiveness. Instead of complaining about their position, she said, Quebecers should improve and then act upon it.

Jean Paul Desrosiers said things would be better if the federal government abandoned its "centralizing attitude" and would rather be associated with the Anglo-Saxon element than dominating it, he said.

Many participants in the discussion said English is poorly taught in the lower St. Lawrence region and some knowledge of the language is essential in business advancement. Opponents said English should not be taught at all and the schools should concentrate on French.

The commission was told that 100,025 of the 265,775 people living in this region—Rimouski, Matane and Temiscouata counties—speak French only. Another 14,388 described themselves in the 1961 census as bilingual in business advancement.
