## Reds Reject Port Protest

**MOSCOW (AP)**—The Soviet Union Wednesday rejected British, American and Japanese protests against the closing of Vladivostok Bay to foreign sea and air transport.

The Soviet Union said the big Far East port is Russian territory and protests that freedom of navigation and shipping are being violated are utterly groundless.

Russia said no further discussions on the matter are necessary.

The Soviet Union last July 21 ordered the closing of the port area known as Peter the Great Bay. The Russians gave no explanation at that time.

The Russians, in their reply, insisted "that last year's Soviet decision fully confirmed the frontiers of territorial waters set up over 50 years ago."

## Farm Company To Produce New Heat-Resistant Metal

**TORONTO (CP)**—A giant Canadian mining company, and one of the country's largest chemical firms have joined forces to form a new company—Rio Tinto-Dow Ltd.—apparently to do research on a strategic heat-resistant alloy.

The formation of the new company was announced Tuesday by Robert Winters, president of Rio Tinto Mining Company of Canada Ltd., and L. D. Smithers, president and general manager of Dow Chemical of Canada Ltd.

Their statement said the new company will concentrate on the production of thorium and rare earths found in by-product materials produced at Rio Tinto's uranium mining properties. But The Globe and Mail says the prime project is research and development of master alloy, a combination of thorium and magnesium.

The paper quotes a source close to Rio Tinto as saying the importance of the new company's production will be of "the greatest magnitude" to the Western world, and, additionally, to the Blind River, Ont., uranium area.

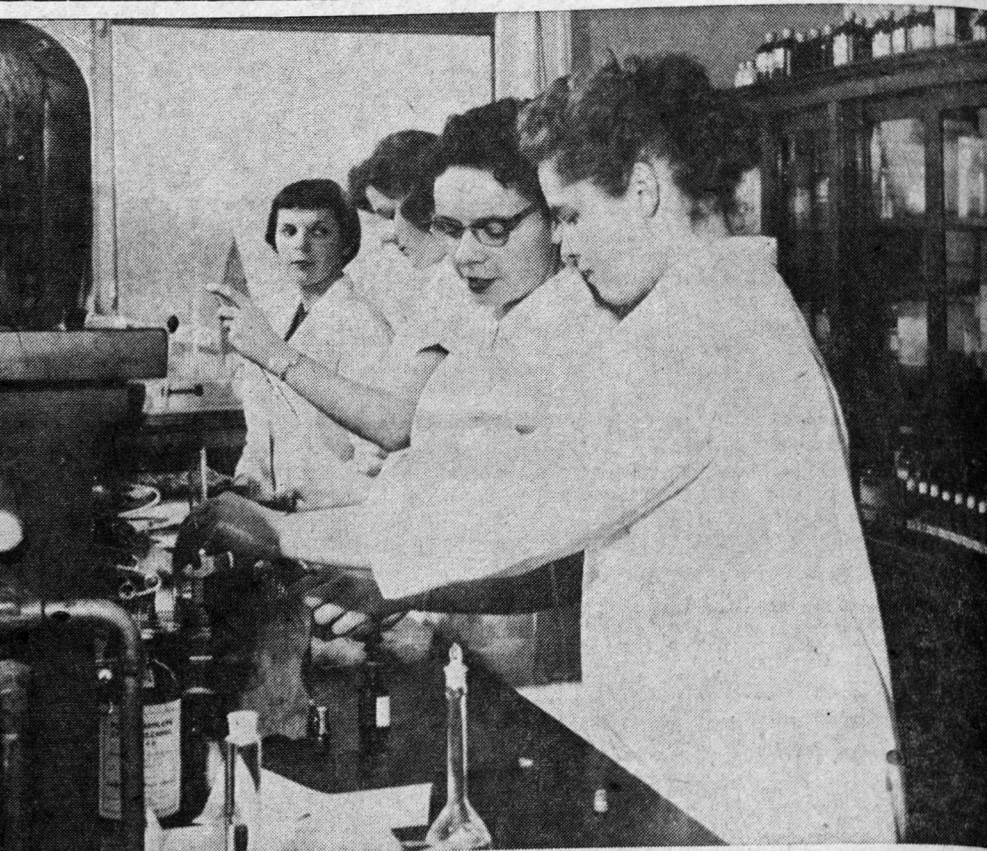

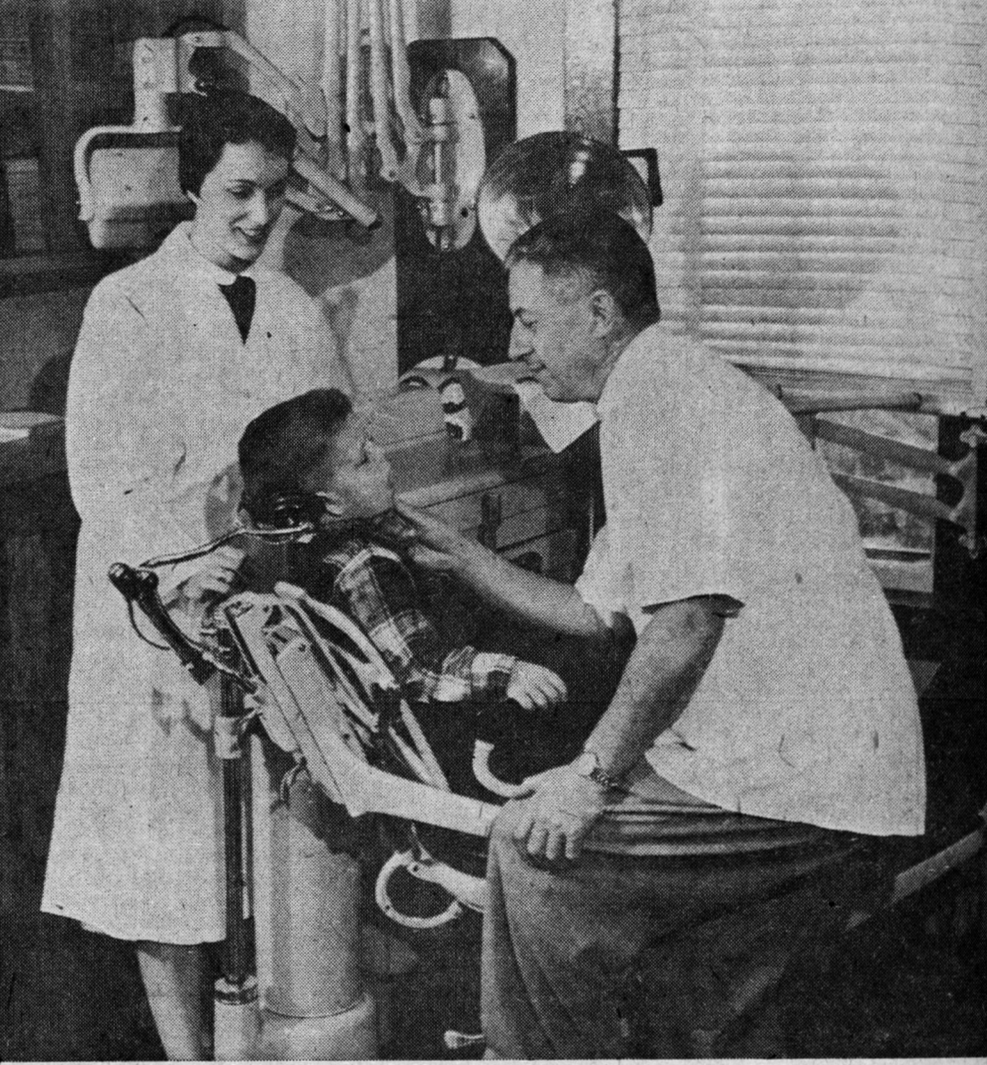

ed benefit to children with dental disabilities of this type. The clinic is operated on a referral basis by the dentists of the province. Actual treatment may be carried out at the clinic or by the family dentist under the supervision of the director.

The four dental hygienists continued to hold clinics for dental examinations at various centres in the province and a dental education program in the schools was also conducted.

Topical fluoridation clinics have been on a voluntary basis for preschool children and for school children up to thirteen years of age who present a certificate from their family dentist stating that all necessary fillings and extractions have been completed for the child.

Division of Sanitary Engineering—An extensive program in restaurant sanitation was carried out in 1957 following an agreement between the Division and the City of Charlottetown and the Town of Summerside. Both municipalities agreed to enforce recommendations on restaurants made by the Division under the "Health Act" and "Eating Establishments."

The Veterinarian worked with raw milk producers during the year to see that raw milk reaching pasteurization plants was in satisfactory condition. Routine inspections of dairies were carried out by the Inspectors and weekly spot samples of milk were collected from delivery trucks.

Work was also carried out in the control of water and sewage systems particularly in conjunction with Town Planning Regulations.

**TUBERCULOSIS CONTROL**

Patients admitted to the Sanatorium this year number about the same as last, indicating that a plateau may have been reached after a decline in the number of cases over the previous years.

Outpatient clinics were held throughout the year at various centres on the Island as well as at the Sanatorium.

An intensive program of tuberculin testing followed by x-raying of positive reactors was carried out in selected areas in the province during the year. This method of detecting unsuspected cases of tuberculosis is considered highly effective and more economical than mass x-ray surveys.

Following the death of Dr. Creelman, Dr. E.M. Found became Director of the Division

and Superintendent of the Sanatorium. Dr. Found had for many years directed the operation of the Out-Patient Clinic for the Division.

The installation of the x-ray machine at the Prince County Hospital for routine x-raying of all admissions is a step forward in the detection of unknown tuberculosis cases.

**MENTAL HEALTH**

With the opening of Hillsborough General Hospital in East Royalty, this Division now compares favorably with any Mental Health Division in Canada. When Dr. Robert Forsythe received his certification from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons (Canada) a short time ago, the Division became the first in Canada to be completely staffed by Certified Psychiatrists.

Aside from the work performed at the Riverside Mental and the Hillsborough General Hospitals, clinics were held daily at the Mental Health offices on Fitzroy Street. Patients are accepted at the clinic only on a referral basis from private physicians.

A member of the staff routinely visits school teachers throughout the province to discuss any problems relating to mental health that may arise in the classroom.

**CANCER CONTROL**

The director, who has had specialized postgraduate training in the cancer field, held consultations on 424 patients in hospitals referred to him by practicing physicians in the province. Specimens are routinely sent to the Division of Laboratories for examination and diagnosis. The work carried out by this Division differs from and is not related to the program of the Prince Edward Island Cancer Society.

**Vital Statistics**—Records are kept by the Division on all births, deaths and causes of deaths, and marriages occurring on the Island. Records are also kept on all hospital admissions in the province as well as a record of reportable diseases submitted by private physicians.

A member of the Division recently attended a special course on the operation of International Business Machines and on the registration of cause-of-death certificates. These machines, located in the Health Department, are in constant use and have proven their value in the compilation and interpretation of information from several Departments of Government.

Laboratories—The Division performs several laboratory functions including Bacteriology, Serology; Biochemistry Hematology, Hist-Pathology, and Parasitology which provide advanced diagnostic services for all hospitals in the province, the Department of Agriculture, the Attorney-General as well as for all Divisions of the Department of Health.

The Health Department was fortunate to obtain the services of three senior residents in pathology during their vacation from Dalhousie University, Halifax, N.S. pending the appointment of a Director of Laboratories in this province. It is expected that this position will be filled in the near future.

**HEALTH EDUCATION**

The Health Educator worked mainly with the Directors and staff of other Divisions in the Department of Health. He is located in Central Administration and works with all Divisions of the Department upon request. In 1957, as in the previous year, he took an active part in the Tuberculin Testing Survey currently being conducted in the Province. He also does some work with other organizations carrying on programs related to health. His other duties included writing of press releases for the Department, screening of pamphlets, posters, films, the ordering and dissemination of health literature, as well as giving talks on Public Health and related subjects throughout the year.

**Administration**—Other than the normal administration of any such large Department, the Deputy Minister has played a very active part in the compilation of information regarding Hospital Insurance in the province, and he also administered the National Health Grants. The Health Officer, because of the additional duties presently carried by the Deputy Minister, supervises all Divisions with exception of Mental Health and Laboratories. He is also acting director of the Division of Sanitary Engineering and during the past year has, in conjunction with the Bacteriology, conducted investigations on Staphylococcal and Salmonella infections that occurred in the province.

The Minister thanked the management of the various newspapers, the two radio stations and the television stations for the splendid co-operation and help received from them during the year. "The past year is considered one of accomplishment and we are hoping that the services to the public will continue to be made available and be as well received in 1958 as the Minister concluded.
