FLIES PACIFIC ALONE BRISBANE (Reuters)—A 33-year-old aircraft salesman, Kenneth Walker, Monday completed the first solo flight in a single-engine plane from the United States to Australia. Walker, an American, landed here in a Piper Comanche 200 to be diverting to the New South Wales Aero Club at Newcastle. He made the flight in four hops—the longest was from San Francisco to Honolulu, a distance of 3,400 miles. For this he was in the cockpit 15 hours.

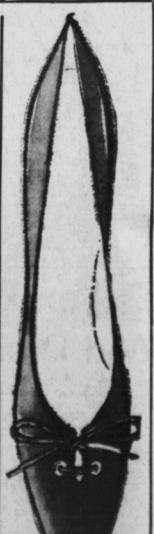
