During his long association with Lord Baden-Powell in scouting Sir Percy is credited with having officially opened well over one hundred Boy Scout and Girl Guide headquarters in various parts of the British Isles. ## Out—Damned Spot

The Anti-Steel-Trap League believes in a law to eliminate this horror because a law saved our eggs, a law saved our song birds, a law protected our fur-seals, a law stopped live pigeon shooting at the traps and a law gives sanctuary to migratory birds. Yet it was not longer ago than 1888 that George Thorndike Angel, that good Samaritan of the home, was told by a Massachusetts legislator that if he expected to have laws passed for dumb brutes he would find himself much disappointed. The question of steel-traps is peculiarly the woman's question.

It is she who wears the fur. If, as an eminent philosopher has said, immorality consists chiefly in inflicting unnecessary and unproductive pain, we women are guilty because we aid and abet and condone. Melancholy predictions have been made that women will not relieve the distress of fur-bearers if it must be done at the cost of personal sacrifice but I am happy to say that the important General Federation of Women's Clubs, as well as hundreds of similar organizations, has passed a resolution approving the aims of the Anti-Steel-Trap League.

We do not fight the wearing of fur nor the fur trade, but we do insist that the fur taken shall be decently taken in humane traps so animals may become ethically legitimate articles of commerce. To a sensitive conscience the mass martyrdom of one hundred million animals is too great a price to pay for vanity.

## Cruelty Unseen goes Unheeded

It is interesting to note that the primitive methods of fur getting by the low-browed cave man with his bludgeon, and the box traps and deadfalls of the Indians were comparatively humane. Death was quick and sure. It remained for a nineteenth century white man by the name of Newhouse, calling himself a Christian, Puritanist and retiring to the Oneida Community there to live a life of Christ-like purity, to invent the barbarous steel-trap.
