Island athletes lifted their point total to 19 Saturday in the final day of the Eastern Canadian Age Class track and field championships, capturing one first, two seconds and a third.

Robert Waugh, Summerside, picked up the island's second first place win Saturday morning, clearing the javelin pole vault at 10' 6" to defeat the sole other competitor Don Barry, Antigonish.

Andy Arsenault, raised his personal points total to 11 by placing second in the Junior 150 and three mile. He had won the mile Friday.

The 18-year-old Charlottetown runner took over the lead of the 800 run on the back stretch of the final lap Saturday only to have Dave Ellis, Windsor, Quebec, come from 20 years back in the stretch and nip Arsenault at the wire. Ellis' time was 1:58.8.

SECOND IN A-MILE

Arsenault's entry in the 3-mile Saturday afternoon was unexpected but the Islander maintained a steady pace over the long grid to finish second to Doug Scott, Perth, Ont., who won in 15:05.3. Arsenault's time was 15:28.4.

Rob Lockett, Bridgetown, N.S., current holder of the Canadian 1/2 mile record, ran neck-and-neck with Scorer until the half way mark when he dropped

out. He said later that he hadn't felt right.

Joe Cheverie, Tipton, picked up the Islanders' other significant point Saturday, finishing third in the 1/2 mile high jump with a leap of 5' 8". Paul Keare, Ipswich, won the event with 5' 8".

Competition was Paul MacLennan, Summerside, third in the 1/2 mile high jump, and Heather MacLennan, Charlottetown, third in the Women's 1/2 mile high jump.

and athletes performing here," Pete Beak, Toronto, chairman of the Olympic Games selection committee said Saturday.

"After seeing Turner perform I'd have to say she is definitely Olympic material. She is a terrifically strong legs and runs very relaxed. If Turner comes up against someone who can push her in the 100, there's no telling what she might do."

Although Turner was at her best in the 100 at the Eastern Canadian meet, several Marjorie Beak has since become a school legend in her own time.

Her vast improvement in track indicates that she has reached her peak performance. At the Acadia Relay, Wolfville, June 27, Turner ran the third competitive 100-yard dash of her brief career in 11.6 seconds. Two weeks later at Chesler, she ran 11.2, July 16 at the Antigonish High School Games she ran 11.1, and Friday she broke the 11-second barrier for the 6th time in her career.

In May and June, Turner kept in condition by running on the beach near her Lockport home. Conditions were haphazard and there wasn't a track coach in Lockport who could help her so she moved to Halifax for the summer and has performed with the Halifax Track and Field Club. Her coach is Dave Lucka, former N.S. broad jump and triple jump record holder.
