Neale says there is nothing wrong with making a holiday resort on Great Saltee even if Neale's title of prince is not recognized.

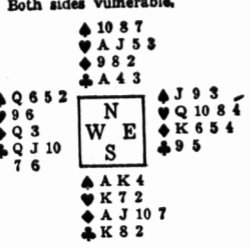
But if Great Saltee is not to be an independent principality what about the Republic of Ireland?

The bidding: South West North East 1NT Pass 2NT Pass 3NT

Opening lead—queen of clubs. One of the troubles with sitting behind a good player and watching him perform is that the operation usually goes off so smoothly that you don't realize how skillful the play has been.

The technique employed by the expert was not remarkable. All he did was perform a good workmanlike job to get his nine tricks.

The opening lead was won in dummy. A low diamond to the jack lost to West's Queen. The jack of clubs was declined by South, but he won the next club.

Declarer played the king and another heart, finessing the jack, which lost. Back came a spade, which South won.

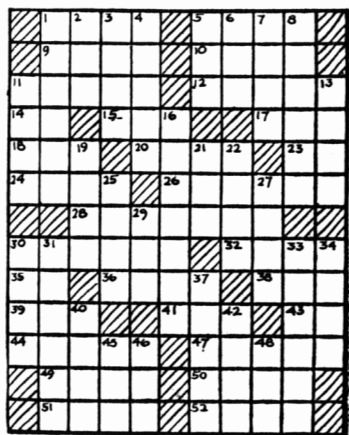
The appeal court action was launched after Northumberland county court judge J. L. Ryan refused to proceed with a recount.

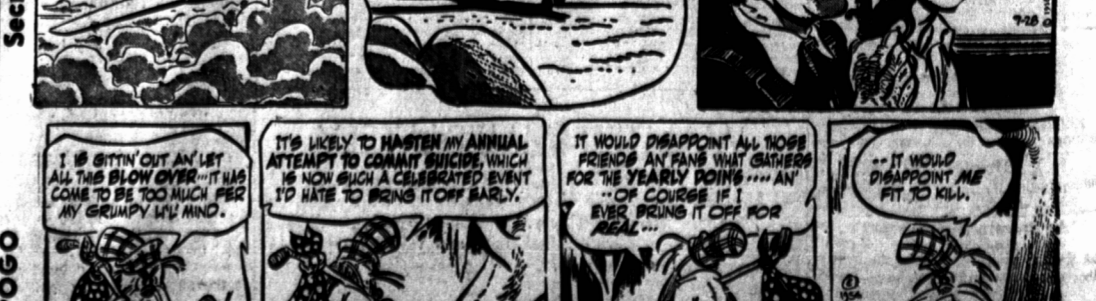
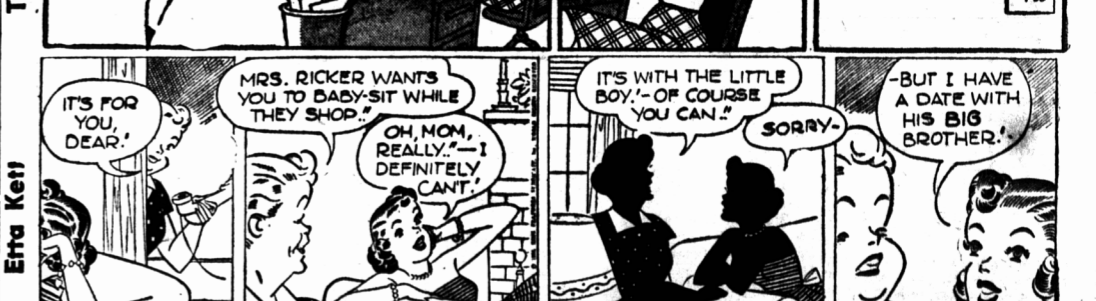
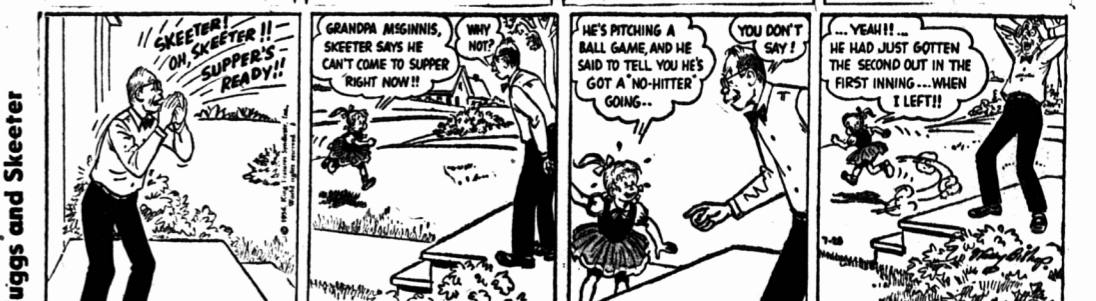
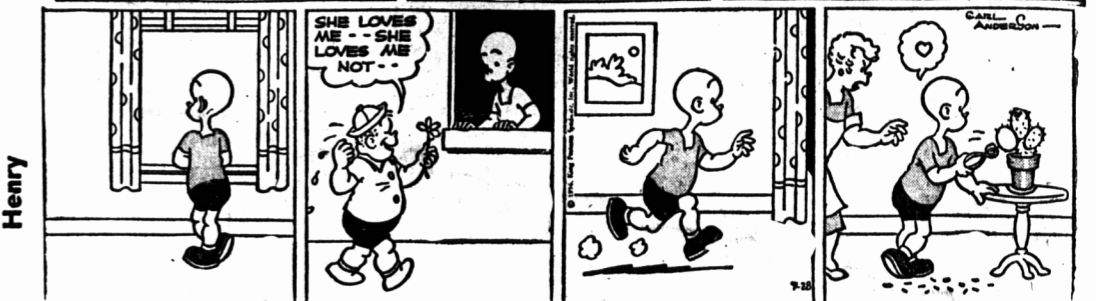


DAILY CRYPTOQUOTE — Here's how to work it:

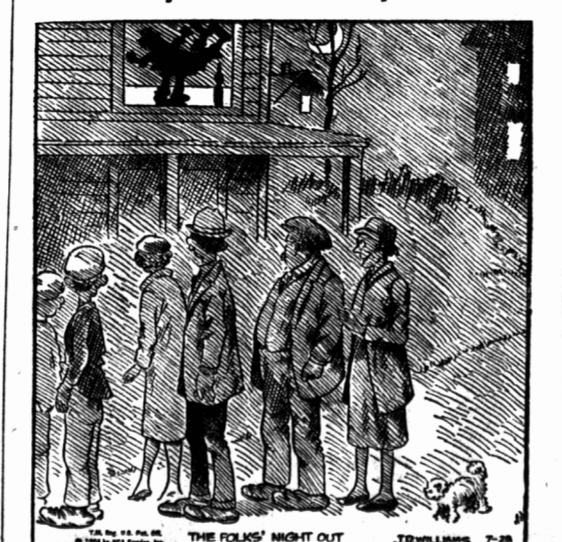
