Terrific detonations were heard on the 29th from the volcanic island of Krakatoa, in the Mala archipelago. They were audible at Soerakrata on the island of Java.

A despatch to the Paris Figaro from Saigon says that M. Harmand, French Civil Commissioner, has gone to Hue at the special request of the Emperor of Annam, who is desirous of placing himself and capital under French protection, as his position is most insecure.

He nearly lost his life on the first day of the bombardment by the French of forts and batteries at the mouth of the River Hue. M. Harmand is provided with the most complete powers to negotiate with the Emperor and is instructed to obtain from him a strict definition of the protectorate over Annam conferred by France by existing treaties.

He is also instructed to demand that the Annamite bands encamped in Tonquin be immediately recalled.

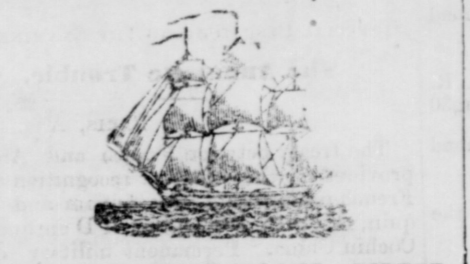

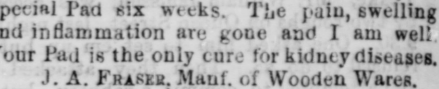
