DOMINION PARLIAMENT

Summary of Proceedings.

OTTAWA, March 21. Hon. C. H. Tupper introduced a bill respecting the harbor of Belleville.

On motion for the third reading of Hon. Mr. Haggart's Bill respecting postmasters' salaries, etc., Sir Richard Cartwright moved an amendment, providing that the salary paid to any postmaster shall not exceed \$3,200 per annum.

The House divided on this amendment which was lost on a vote of 68 yeas to 113 nays.

The resolution amending the Customs Act was considered in committee and adopted, and a bill founded upon it introduced.

Considerable progress was made with the bill and at 11.50 the Committee rose and the House adjourned.
