TORONTO (CP)—Dr. Evelyn Patricia Wilford, 29, whose plans to start a medical practice in Toronto were almost complete, died

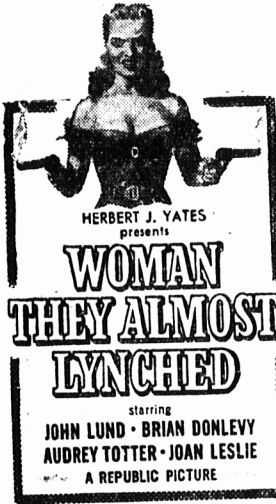

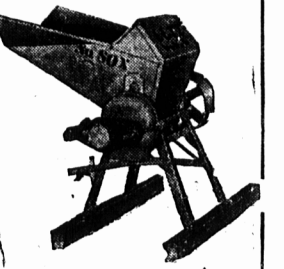
