Appointment Of New Lieut.-Gov. Announced

OTTAWA (CP) — Dr. William Joseph Parcell MacMillan, 76-year-old former Conservative premier of Prince Edward Island, Friday was appointed lieutenant-governor of the island.

The appointment, announced by Prime Minister Diefenbaker, is effective Dec. 16. Dr. MacMillan, a physician and surgeon, succeeded T. William Provost, 69, who has been in office since 1950.

A native of Clermont, P.E.I., Dr. MacMillan was the island's premier from Oct. 14, 1933 until Aug. 15, 1935.

He was the island province's first minister of education, and when its department of health was organized in 1931 he was its first minister. He was first elected to the Legislature in 1927.

Dr. MacMillan is a graduate of Prince of Wales College and McGill University. For a number of years he has been president and a leading figure in a number of civic organizations. They include the Canadian Red Cross Society, the Children's Aid Society of Charlottetown, the Prince Edward Island Association, the Central Canadian, the Canadian and the Prince Edward Island Medical Association, and the P.E.I.
