

Modern Artillery Improvements.

A side-splitting incident occurred at a novel experiment at Woolwich, England.

It was at one time proposed to fire mountain guns off the backs of mules that carried them.

A mule or donkey was procured, and a small gun strapped firmly to a cradle resting on the back-saddle, so that the muzzle of the weapon pointed over the donkey's tail.

On arrival at the butt, the gun was loaded, the donkey turned with his tail toward the eastern mound, and the usual preparations made for firing by means of a lanyard and friction tube.

A discussion followed, and it was finally arranged to fire the gun by a piece of slow match tied to the vent. This was accordingly done, and the match duly ignited.

That Jackson was only acquitted because he was protected by the Orangemen.

That Sir John wrote to Winnipeg to prepare the battalions to strike at the French Canadians.

That Riel was hung solely in obedience to the Orangemen.

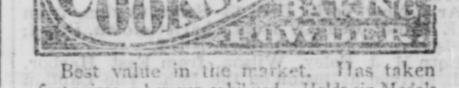
