## Rights Of Pedestrians And Drivers Clarified

On the charge of failing to yield the right-of-way to pedestrians in a crosswalk, a accused was fined \$5 without costs or one day in jail by Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court yesterday.

He said that at crosswalks there is a certain onus placed on the pedestrian, in that he must determine, before stepping into the intersection, whether there is sufficient time to cross safely in advance of the oncoming traffic.

Before passing sentence, the magistrate said he made a thorough study of the case, along with the city by-laws and the section of the Highway Traffic Act, and had been able to reach two conclusions.

"However," he said, "once he is in the act of traversing the crosswalk, a pedestrian may presume that any oncoming traffic will stop to permit passage."

On the part of a driver of a motor vehicle, the magistrate said that at all times he should realize that the vehicle he has under his control is, in a sense, "a lethal weapon."

ALBERTON — Cloris J. Duce, DeBolt, was fined \$100 and costs or 15 days in jail and cost for driving while impaired.

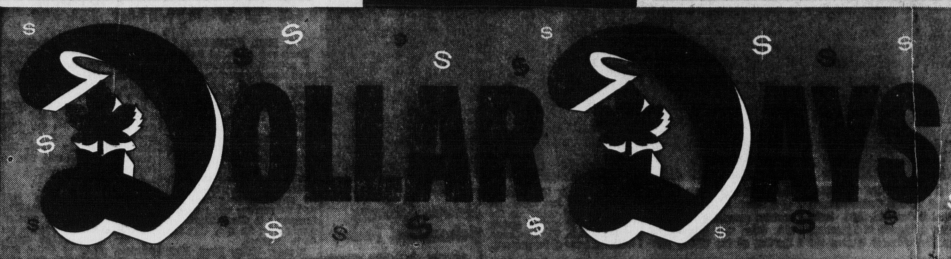
Another man was fined \$20 and cost for illegal possession of liquor and a second person was fined \$25 and costs for being intoxicated.
