

National Council of Women Meeting in Fredericton, N. B.

FREDERICTON, (CP) — Club women representing every section of the Dominion arrived here yesterday for the first meeting of the National Council of Women which begins Friday at the University of New Brunswick.

More than 100 delegates are expected to attend the seven-day council meeting to study and discuss women's role in Canada's political and economic life. An objective is to plan methods of getting women appointed to the civil service commission and the labor department. Most pressing discussion topic will be the present unemployment situation.

The council represents a wide cross-section of female opinion in Canada as it is made up of representatives from various women's organizations in nearly every province.

An aim this year is to draw the two island provinces, Newfoundland and Prince Edward Island, into the council. Representatives have been invited to the meeting.

National President Mrs. A. Turner Bone of Montreal will arrive Friday from Helsinki, Finland, where she has been attending the International Council of Women. Mrs. Turner Bone will address the council at the opening and later in the week will report on the Helsinki conference.

Liberal Senator Muriel McQueen Ferguson of Fredericton will be featured speaker at the council next Tuesday. She will discuss women in volunteer work and public life. The first woman senator appointed from New Brunswick, Miss Ferguson recently fought and won a battle to have women serve on juries in her home province.
