The minutes of the annual meeting were read by the secretary, Sister St. Angela Marie. The financial report was given by the treasurer, Mrs. Russell J. Perry.

It was agreed the home and school will entertain a group of the elementary school with a Halloween party and the high school students will be entertained at a party later that same evening.

Sister St. Mary Arnold, principal of the regional high school, introduced the teachers and the principals reported an increased enrollment over that of last year.

Chairman appointed were: Mrs. Mary Hogan, family life committee; Mrs. Alvide Boudreau, school life; Cyril Arsenault, community life; and Wilf Boyce, finance; Mrs. Milton Keough, membership.

Kildare Native Msgr. Foley Dies In Minnesota At Age 87

ALBERTON—Rev. John P. Foley, a native of this province died on Wednesday in Faribault, Minn. The news was received immediately by his relatives here.

Msgr. Foley was a son of the late Patrick E. Foley and Margaret Cahill, was born at Kildare 87 years ago. He was the last surviving member of his family.

After graduating from Saint Dunstan's University in Charlottetown he taught for three years in his home school at Central Kildare. He then went to the United States.

In 1902 he entered St. Paul Seminary and six years later was ordained to the priesthood. He joined the staff of St. Thomas College and remained there almost 20 years as instructor and administrator. In 1928 he became pastor of the Immaculate Conception Church in Faribault and under his leadership the parish grew and prospered.

Seven years ago the parish celebrated its 100th anniversary and at the same time his parishioners celebrated the 15th anniversary of their priest's ordination which was then approaching. Very soon after this occasion the title of Monsignor was conferred upon him.

Pollution Information Gathered

Information on water pollution problems in the province was gathered during the past few days by a research associate of the Canadian Council of Resource Ministers.

George Francis met in Charlottetown with Agriculture Minister Andrew MacRae and Industry and Natural Resources Minister Leo Rossier last week.

Mr. Rossier said Mr. Francis "was getting information on pollution from various government departments and this preliminary information, along with that from other provinces, may lead to a federal-provincial conference on pollution."

Mr. Rossier said Mr. Francis' findings will be discussed at a meeting of the council co-ordinating committee in Montreal next month. Chairman of the committee is Eugene Gorman, deputy minister of fisheries for the province.

W. Royalty Cow Wins Silver Medal Certificate

A Prince Edward Island Guernsey cow, Patasia Instone, has qualified for a silver medal certificate in production for owner J. Eric Hurry. We st Royalty, with production of 60,876 pounds milk, 2,969 butterfat in six lactations. The breed class averages were 125 in milk, 119 in fat.

Another cow from the Hurry herd, Patasia Silverlocks Verben, qualified for a record of production as a three-year-old seller with 3,738 pounds of milk, 445 fat for BCAs of 120 in milk, 122 in fat.

Five Cases Heard In Police Court

Maurice O'Connell, Little York, charged with driving without due care and attention, was fined \$75 and costs or 30 days before Magistrate A.J. Haslam in city police court Saturday morning.

For failing to stop at a red traffic light, Francis Ernest Peters of Tignish was fined \$10 and costs or five days for speeding.

Two people were accused of being drunk and incapable. One of the accused was given a 30 day suspended sentence and the other accused was remanded until Oct. 20.

Charged with being drunk and disorderly, Harold Hughes of Charlottetown was fined \$20 and costs or 30 days. Ronald Woodgate Mermaid was remanded until Oct. 20 on a similar charge.
