

Maj. Gormley Wins Ottawa Aggregate At Rifle Shoot

A welcome to all the riflemen was expressed by Brigadier W. W. Reid, D.S.O., E.D., president of the P. E. I. Rifle Association as he presided at the annual dinner held at the conclusion of the four-day shoot. There were approximately 90 present.

The Ottawa Aggregate was won by Maj. A. F. Gormley with a total of 707 points enabling him to win the D.C.R.A. Silver Medal. The Bronze Medal was won by Maj. (Rev.) George A. MacDonald.

The Nicholson Tyro Match was taken by Cadet B. Connolly with a score of 686 in the aggregate, while the William D. S. MacDonald Aggregate was also taken by Cadet Connolly. The United Services Officers Club Match was won by Pte. M. M. Wood of the North Nova Scotia Highlanders with Officer Cadet R. Hambly, R.A.S.C. in second place.

Major Gormley took the Jones Memorial Match, fired at 300, 500 and 600 yards. Seated at the head table with Brig. Reid were Mr. and Mrs. George Rogers, Lieut. Col. D. J. MacCormack, officer commanding the 28th I.A.A. Regiment; Major Fred Jenkins, 5 Signals Regiment; Capt. Jack McCarville, 21st Field Ambulance; Major R. D. McGilivray, Mr. F. J.
