If you are involved in raids on residences you are reminded that you are spending our money by your

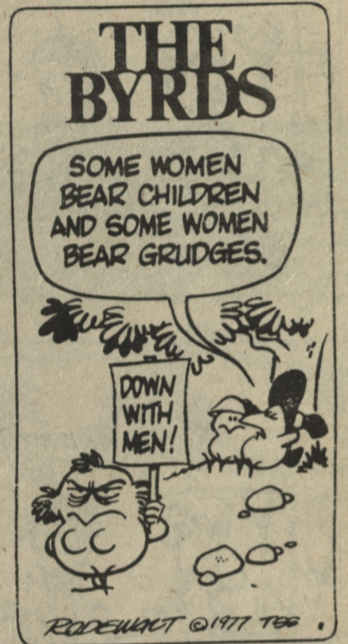
immature acts. Recent damage has been extensive at Blanchard and these damages are paid through a CAUTION FEE which we pay at the start of each year.

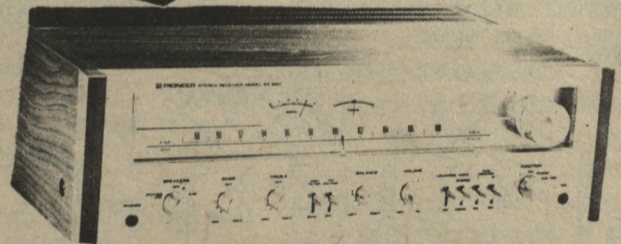
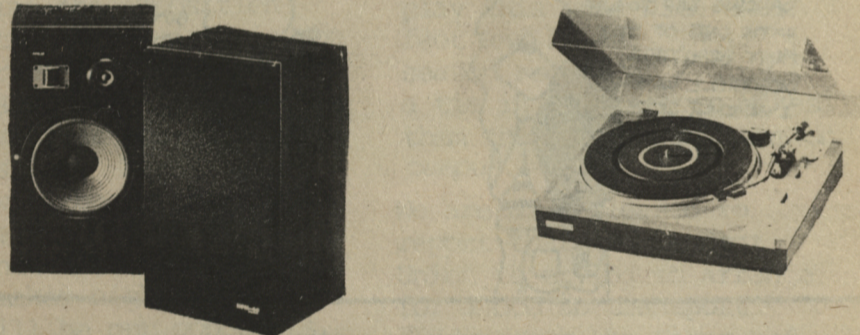
