THE PROBLEM IN CHINA

A Strong Force to Overcome

FIFTY MISSIONARIES HAVE BEEN KILLED.

Desperate Straits of Legations—No Word From Relief Force.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

St. PETERSBURG, Aug. 3.—Advices received by the Russian general staff from Tein Tain estimate that there are 50,000 trained Chinese troops in Pekin, in addition to a large force of Boxers whose strength is not yet broken.

In the opinion of the General staff the march on Pekin before the end of the rainy season will be risky, the climate being changeable.

WASHINGTON, Aug. 3rd.—Secretary Hay's reply to Li Hung Chang has closed negotiations with China, unless the old Viceroy is able to secure the full acceptance of our terms relative to the foreign ministers, and that a once.

No orders, therefore, looking to the relaxation of preparations for an advance on Pekin have gone out from Washington, for, as the situation is described by one leading official, there will be no bargaining on our part in advance of concession by the Chinese authorities or full and free communication with foreign ministers.

There is, moreover, a note ominously close to an actual declaration of war, in Secretary Hay's assertion that the Chinese government is unfriendly.

That kind of language is the extreme of diplomacy, and it is only a narrow step between it and formal war.

CASUALTIES SIXTY PER CENT.

LONDON, Aug. 3.—From Shanghai, the Daily Express has received confirmation of the reported murder of fifty missionaries in the Province of Shan Si with additional information that English women were dragged out of the mission buildings by a Chinese mob who beheaded them in the streets of Chu Hon.

The Tien Tsin correspondent of the Standard says that a heartrending letter has been received from the Japanese Legation, dated July 22, stating that the casualties number sixty per cent, and that only 25 cartridges per man are left, with rations sufficient for five days, and it is feared that the legation will succumb within a week.

TERRIBLE MASSACRE.

LONDON, Aug. 3.—No word comes this morning regarding the fortunes of the comparatively small body of troops believed to be forcing their way toward Pekin.

The silence is probably due to the diligent censorship rather than any lack of developments.

According to the Daily Express, however, a cablegram from Che Foo announces that the imperial troops advancing to oppose the relief force have completely wiped out the Christian town near Pekin, killing five foreign priests and 10,000 native Christians.

Suspended From The House of Commons.

LONDON, Aug. 3.—Dr. Tanner, the Irish nationalist member, has been suspended from the House of Commons for disorderly conduct.

Blake Retained.

OTTAWA, Aug. 1.—Edward Blake has been retained by the government to argue the case of the six Canadian sealing vessels whose claims against Russia for seizure in the North Pacific in 1893 have been referred to arbitration.

Cost of the War.

LONDON, Aug. 2.—During the debate in the House of Commons today on the bill for a supplemental war loan of £3,500,000, Sir Wm. Vernon Harcourt, liberal, said that owing to the existence of three fragmentary budgets he was unable to conclude at what the government figured the cost of the war. He estimated that it would be nearer £30,000,000 than £60,000,000. Sir William added that statements of the highest authority were impressing upon the British the fact that they were the best hated people in the world. Lord Salisbury could not understand the reason of hatred. Lord Rosebery knew the cause of hatred. Lord Rosebery had declared that the empire needed peace. The last twenty years Great Britain had been laying hands with almost frantic eagerness on every desirable tract of territory adjacent to its own. This greed excited envy and stood in the way of domestic reforms. The chancellor of the exchequer, Sir Michael Hicks-Beach, in reply, said the figures were complicated, but he would make a return showing how they had been reached.

ASSASSINATION--ATTEMPT ON THE SHAH

Defeated By a Miracle.

THE SHAH ASKS TO HAVE THE MAN'S PHOTOGRAPH

And Tells the Coachman to Drive On.

PARIS, Aug. 3.—An attempt was made yesterday to assassinate the Shah of Persia. A man broke through the line of police and mounted the Shah's carriage. He had a revolver in his hand but was overpowered before he could pull the trigger.

LATER.

PARIS, Aug. 3.—Further details of the attempt upon the Shah's life have been gleaned.

The assailant moved quickly, and in an instant he was on the carriage step, holding the door with his left hand, with his right he pushed a revolver towards the breast of the Shah.

He seemed to hesitate for a moment as though undecided where to aim. This hesitation saved the Shah's life, for before the would-be assassin could pull the trigger a strong hand grasped his wrist and wrenched it so that the weapon dropped harmlessly to the bottom of the landau.

"I would like to have a photograph of that man," nonchalantly exclaimed the Shah. Then addressing a few words in this native tongue to his companions in the carriage, he told the coachmen to drive on.
