CURRENT NOTES.

Diphtheria is spreading alarmingly in New York city. Adolf Due Cher, at present vice-president of Switzerland, has been elected president for the year 1886. He is a radical.

When you have spilled anything on the stove, or milk has boiled over and a suffocating smoke arises, sprinkle the spot with salt and it will disappear immediately.

A DISINFECTING MIXTURE.—Make a solution of 1 1/2 parts of nitric acid in thirty parts of water; mix with it ten parts of oil of rosemary, 2 1/2 parts of thyme and 2 1/2 parts of oil of lavender. Bottle the mixture, and before using shake thoroughly.

The Broad Arrow of the 28th ult., says: Major-General Laurie, who has proceeded to the seat of war on the frontiers of Servia and Bulgaria, as commissioner from the National Society for furnishing aid to the wounded, has considerable experience of active operations in the field, having served throughout the Crimean war and during the Indian mutiny; and also went to South Africa with Sir Frederick Roberts, and so saw how operations were conducted in that country; and during the late rebellion in the Canadian Northwest, was second in command under General Middleton, and held the appointment of commandant of base and lines of communication, which involved continuous supervision of transport and supply, as well as the organization and control of the base hospitals—an eminently suitable training for the present work which he has undertaken.

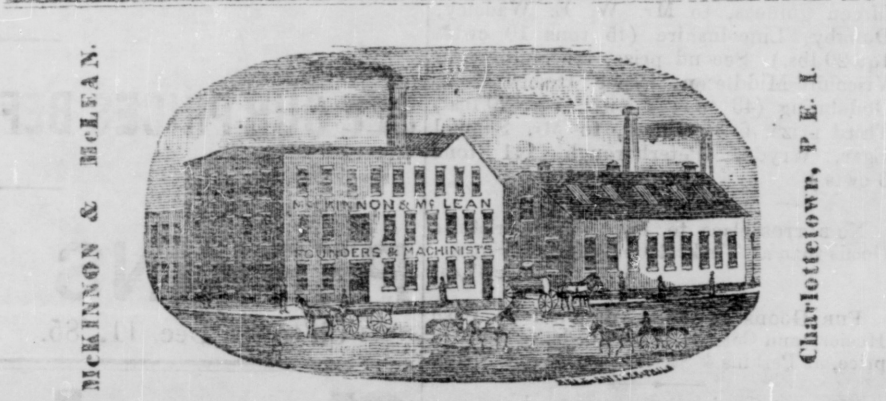
