**MRS. GEORGE E. BROWN**

The funeral was held at the Kensington United Church, which she formerly attended. The service was conducted by the Rev. W. J. MacLeod, who gave testimony of her sterling character, and paid tribute to the warmth of hospitality ever enjoyed by all who visited her home.

Interment was in Kensington People's Cemetery where she was laid to rest beside her husband, who pre-deceased her five years ago.

**TORONTO (CP)** — The stock market shook off its irregular and mixed condition Thursday to stage a mild but determined advance. It was the second day of bullish underlines in the market.

All indices recorded gains above the previous day's closing with western oils up almost three points.

International Nickel featured senior base metals, adding \$2.25 to \$4 and Noranda gained 1/4. Sherrill Gordon was up 15 cents, and Falconbridge 1/4. Nickel Rim gained 25 cents among juniors and North Rankin added 17 cents. Cowichan Copper was off 49 cents.

Gunnar gained a point among uranium. Algom was up 1/2 and Consolidated Denison 1/4. Rare Earths moved ahead 20 cents.

Pacific Petroleum added 1/4 among western oils and Royalite, Peace River Gas and Calgary and Edmonton about 1/4. Anglo-American lost 1/4.

Index gains: Golds up .05 to 85.55; base metals up 1.20 to 27.72; and western oils up 2.95 to 155.68.
