Transport Board Rules In Favor Of 1 Zone For P.E.I.

OTTAWA, Sept. 16 — (CP) — The Board of transport Commissioners, in a 20-1 majority judgment Saturday ordered the Canadian National Railways to change the Prince Edward Island freight-rate structure to a one-zone from a two-zone plan based on lower so-called "inner zone" rates.

Commissioner H. B. Chase, in his dissenting judgment, noted that the original application was for a one rate zone on Prince Edward Island potatoes and turnips.

The majority judgment, by Mr. Justice M. B. Archibald, Chief Commissioner, and Deputy Chief Commissioner A. Sylvester, pointed out that such a change was suggested by the Turgon Royal Commission on transportation.

Under the existing arbitrary rate zones the favored inner zone enjoys an export shipping differential of five cents a bushel on potatoes and turnips, the crops most affected.

Inner zone producers get more for their potatoes at the minimum price to growers set by the Potato Marketing Board. This inner zone grows in both zones. (Continued on Page 5 Col. 3)

Puts Big Plane Down On Edge Of Chicago

CHICAGO, Sept. 16 — (AP) — Officials credited a veteran pilot with saving 52 lives with "an excellent" forced landing on a non-scheduled airliner today in a sparsely-populated area on the outskirts of Chicago.

No one was killed. Police said 23 of the 48 passengers and crew of four were injured but most suffered only minor bruises.

The plane, carrying 48 passengers, was piloted by Capt. B.J. Mountain and operated by the Safeway Skycoach Airline Transport Company of Chicago on lease from the Peninsular Air Transport Company of Miami Springs, Fla.

Will Sievert, civil aeronautics official, said that about three minutes after takeoff from Midway Airport Mountain radioed the Midway Airport that he was coming back for an emergency landing.
