Final Meeting Of Coronation Committee

The final meeting of the citizens Coronation committee was held last evening in the Town Hall with the chairman Dr. H. E. Clark in the chair. Reports were received from all the chairmen present and it was apparent that all had done the work allotted them in a splendid manner and most of the details in connection with Coronation Day observance had been completed.

Dr. H. E. Clark expressed his deep appreciation to the members for the manner in which each had carried on and said that his work had been made so much easier as a result. The program drawn up was presented and approved and is as follows: The parade will form up facing the Canadian Legion Home at a quarter to one and move off at 1:00 o'clock.

The order of march will be R. C. M. P., P. E. I. Regiment (band and marching personnel), R. C. A. F. (band color party, marching personnel), Air Cadets, Veterans, (Canadian Legion, R. C. A. F. Association, etc.), Boy Scouts, Cubs, Girl Guides, Brownies.

The route of march will be: Water Street to Central, Central to Green, Green to Summer, Summer to Beatty Avenue and from Beatty Avenue along Granville to the ball diamond in Queen Elizabeth Park.

There will be a saluting base in front of the new post office building where the salute will be taken by Group Captain A. G. Kenyon, commanding officer R. C. A. F. Station.

The pupils of St. Mary's Convent will line both sides of Central Street in the vicinity of the Convent and the pupils of Summerside High School will line Green Street and Summer Street near the High School. As the parade passes through they will fall in at the rear of the parade and march with it as far as Queen Elizabeth Park.

On reaching Beatty Ave. the parade will be halted and a dedication of a new flag staff will take place. After the dedication ceremony the parade will move off along Granville Street. The P. E. I. Regiment will proceed down Granville Street to Arcona Street where transport will be waiting to take them to Charlottetown.

The remainder of the parade will turn into the ball park and form a hollow square for the ceremony at that point. The school children will march directly from the area of the new flag staff to the bleachers of the ball park. The High School children will occupy the central or largest section and the pupils of St. Mary's Academy the other smaller sections to the right and left. All the bleacher seats are reserved for the school children. Adults are requested by the authorities not to take these seats before the parade arrives as they will only be asked to vacate them on the arrival of the children.

The parade will be under the command of Major F. J. MacNeill. During the afternoon there will be sports at the ball park consisting of baseball, softball and on the tennis course matches will be played. In the evening old time dancing will be the order of the evening and arrangements have been made by the committee to provide lots of lively music for the occasion. The fireworks committee will go into action at the appointed time and according to indication there will be a splendid display. A huge bonfire will be lit when the evening grows dark and appropriate ceremonies will take place there conducted by the Boy Scouts. —S.

Learn Particulars Of Drowning Accident In North

A letter received yesterday by Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Deighan, Summerside, gave the first particulars on an accident in which their 19-year-old son, John Ernest Deighan, was drowned on May 20 in the Yukon Territory.

The information contained in a copy of a telegram from the R. C. M. P., Watson Lake detachment, said in part, as follows: "John Ernest Deighan, age 19 years, was accidentally drowned in Small Lake, a short distance south of Watson Lake Junction, when a canoe tipped over at approximately 8:30 p.m. on May 20th. Circumstances clearly indicate death by accident and an inquest was considered unnecessary by coroner and R. C. M. P.

"Deighan in company with Robert Straughan, Leo Lawrence McMahon and Russell Edward McMahon were trying out a 14 h.p. motor on canoe. "Each time when starting motor difficulty was experienced, therefore throttle was left on so sufficient fuel would reach the carburetor. When Deighan was attempting to try out canoe the motor started immediately and the canoe darted out into the lake. With full power on Deighan lost balance and grabbed control lever causing canoe to zig-zag and tip over. Deighan surfaced twice but sank, either because of cold water, shock or cramp, as he had eaten just prior to going to lake. "The other men were non-swimmers. Leo McMahon dragged row boat from short distance down shore into water, using piece of floorboard as oar, but could see no trace of Deighan. Russell McMahon immediately got aid at Watson Junction but when he returned with swimmer, Deighan had drowned."

The letter, received from the public administrator for the Yukon Territory, indicated that in compliance with a request from the family, the body will be shipped out by boat or plane, and forwarded by rail to Summerside. —S.
