Conference Welcomed By Atlantic Premiers

HALIFAX (CP)—Premiers of all four Atlantic provinces say they would welcome the chance to talk over area problems with Prime Minister Diefenbaker and his new Conservative government at an early Dominion-provincial conference. From such a meeting Maritimers might expect agreements to give them cheaper electric power and more federal money to meet provincial and municipal bills for health, education and transportation. "It's wonderful," said Liberal Premier Matheson of Prince Edward Island, "even if he does only a fraction of what he's promised." "I would think Mr. Diefenbaker would be very sympathetic to our problems," said New Brunswick's Conservative Premier Flemming. HAS FAITH Premier Smallwood, a Liberal, said he's sure whatever party is in power at Ottawa will do justice to Newfoundland. Conservative Premier Stanfield of Nova Scotia said he looks forward to very cordial relations between his government and the new federal cabinet. When he campaigned in the Maritimes Mr. Diefenbaker spoke in favor of: 1. Federal aid for coal shipments within the Maritimes, including coal for use in steam power plants. 2. More federal money for provincial and municipal governments. 3. Relief for municipalities hit by Ottawa's "tight money" policy. 4. Price supports for fishermen. 5. Higher old age and other pensions. 6. Extension of benefits under the Prairie Farm Rehabilitation Act to other parts of the country. Mr. Diefenbaker talked in particular of the need for cheaper power to attract industry. Premier Stanfield said subventions on coal shipped to Maritime power plants could bring an immediate reduction in rates. Premier Matheson said, "Where he's going to get all the money for these things, I don't know; but it'll be wonderful for Prince Edward Island."

Thousands Of Yank Troops To Come Home

WASHINGTON (AP)—Thousands of the United States military men stationed in foreign lands will be coming home as a result of a global review of defence needs. The operation is being carried out, officials said, to meet as fully as possible the wishes of allied governments and yet avoid any strength. At the same time it must conform to tightening U. S. government budget requirements. A communique issued by President Eisenhower and Japanese Prime Minister Kishi Friday announced a prompt withdrawal of all U. S. ground combat forces from Japan. They will number possibly up to 30,000 men out of an estimated 100,000 now in Japan. The remaining 70,000 will be reduced further by June, 1958.

WANTS DEBT CANCELLED

JOHANNESBURG (Reuters)—South African security police raided offices of non-white labor groups Saturday in a bid to block organization of a demonstration against the government's racial segregation policies. Hundreds of notices have been circulated during the last few days urging Africans to stay away from work next Wednesday in a "day of demonstration" against the Nationalist government's apartheid (segregation) legislation. Parliament enacted several new segregation measures in a session which ended Saturday—the last full meeting before elections next year. The Group Areas Act, defining

the districts where various races may live, was amended and consolidated. Two bills dealing with administration and control of Negroes and another introduced segregation into South African nursing. Not yet made law is the separate University Act, designed to prevent mingling of white and non-white students. It received second reading and then was referred to a select committee for study after powerful opposition both inside and outside Parliament. The most controversial measure in the two bills dealing with control of Negroes is the so-called "church clause." It gives the native affairs minister power to prevent Negroes at religious churches and other institutions in urban areas if their presence "constitutes a nuisance to residents in the vicinity."
