

# Canadiens Defeat Red Wings 2-1 In Overtime

DETROIT (AP)—Andre Pronovost skated the length of the ice and scored the winning goal in sudden death overtime to give the Montreal Canadiens a 2-1 victory and a commanding lead over the Detroit Red Wings in their semi-final series for the Stanley Cup Sunday night. Montreal took a 3-0 lead in the series.

Pronovost picked up a loose puck near Montreal's blue line and raced goalward. He skated around the Detroit defence and pushed in the winner from five feet as goalie Terry Sawchuk slid out to meet him.

The teams had battled scoreless for almost 36 minutes from late in the second period.

It had been a hectic battle as both goalies—Sawchuk and Montreal's Jacques Plante — foiled scoring efforts time after time. The tight, hard-checking battle went into overtime after the teams traded goals within a two-minute span of the second period.

Forbes Kennedy gave the Wings a 1-0 lead at 14:07 on a fluke goal. His 75-foot flip from centre ice took a weird hop over Plante's stick into the Montreal goal. Plante had come out and settled down on one knee to make the save.

A half-minute later, Plante was checked when Bob Bailey crossed the crease. Plante tumbled face down and remained there for three minutes before he was revived.

The teams skated to their dressing rooms and the last 5:22 of the period was tacked onto the third stanza. Plante suffered a bump behind his head, but returned to play brilliantly.

Bernie Geoffrion and Bert Olmstead attempted to fight with Bailey, but were held off. Geoffrion also had an altercation with rinkside fans and shoved his stick at them.

Bailey was given a minor and a 10-minute misconduct penalty. The misconduct was issued by referee Frank Udvari because Bailey didn't go immediately to the penalty box.

While Bailey was banished Montreal scored the equalizer. Dickie Moore got the goal, taking a five-foot backhand swipe and pushing it under Sawchuk. He had taken a pass from Maurice Richard.

This was the ninth overtime playoff game between the two clubs. Each had won four of the other eight. The last one on April 16, 1954, gave the Wings the Stanley Cup when Tony Leswick scored at 4:29 of the first overtime period, the Wings winning 2-1.
