16,500 Federal Employees Will Get Salary Increases

OTTAWA (CP)—The government has announced salary increases and job reclassifications affecting some 16,500 federal employees in administrative and foreign service positions.

The new pay ratings, including an interim increase granted several months ago, carry a price tag of \$15,200,000 a year.

The pay announcement — so complicated that even civil servants affected aren't likely to know the size of their new pay cheque until the first one arrives — said the increases average about 14 per cent.

The increases are staggered with a nine to 11-per-cent jump effective Oct. 1, 1965, including the earlier interim increase, and a four-per-cent mid-pay-cycle increase effective Oct. 1, 1966.

SWEeping CHANGES

Occupational groups affected: Administrative services, computer systems, financial administration, information services, personnel administration, program administration, purchasing and supply, organization and methods welfare programs and administrative trainees.

The new pay plan also embodies new job reclassifications, part of sweeping changes in all civil service posts. Employees in the 10 occupational groups affected now are found in more
