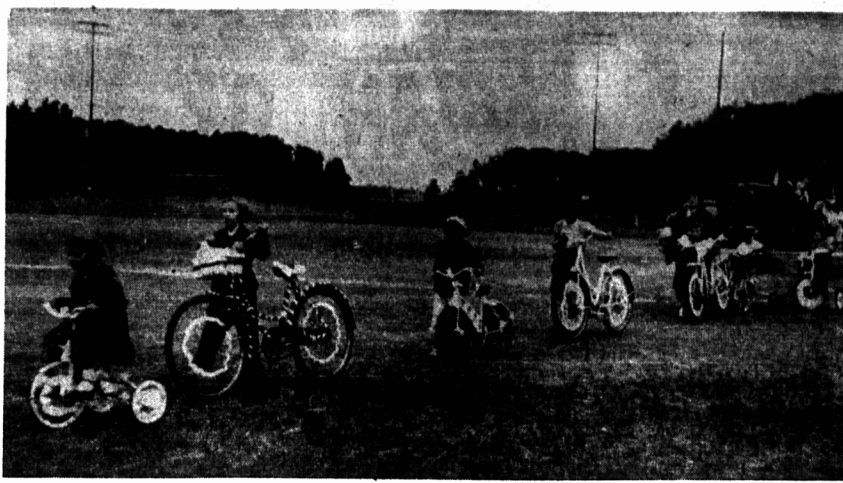
Senators Report Army-McCarthy Row Probe
