

Senator Josie Quart Blasts At Opposition

OTTAWA (CP)—Senator Josie Quart blasted the Liberal and CCF-New Democratic parties claiming they "distort the 'sound' policies of the government and debase Prime Minister Diefenbaker's sincerity."

The Quebec Progressive Conservative said in the Senate through speech debate that "opposition parties in Parliament are criticizing Canada's prime minister and his marvellous record of achievements for purely political purposes."

"We must be alert to the fact that there are Communist forces within our midst willing and ready to turn these criticisms and any state of confusion to their own advantage," she said.

Evidence Heard In Meat Charges

BRANTFORD, Ont. (CP)—An RCMP corporal testified at a preliminary hearing that two men made arrangements to sell him meat from dead animals for human consumption.

Cpl. O. J. Lutes said Robert C. Hooton of Scotland, Ont., and Robert Allen Carrey of Waterdown agreed to sell him meat at \$1 cents a pound which had been collected for animal food.

"They provided sheets of wax paper with Brant County health stamps on them," the officer said, adding that he was to wrap the meat in the paper and sell it in Windsor and Detroit.

Hooton and Carrey are charged with Dr. Ormand C. Raymond with selling meat from dead animals for human consumption.

Dr. Raymond, 38, a veterinarian, is also charged with Charles Thomson of Brantford with conspiracy to sell meat from dead animals for human consumption and with a third charge of selling such meat.

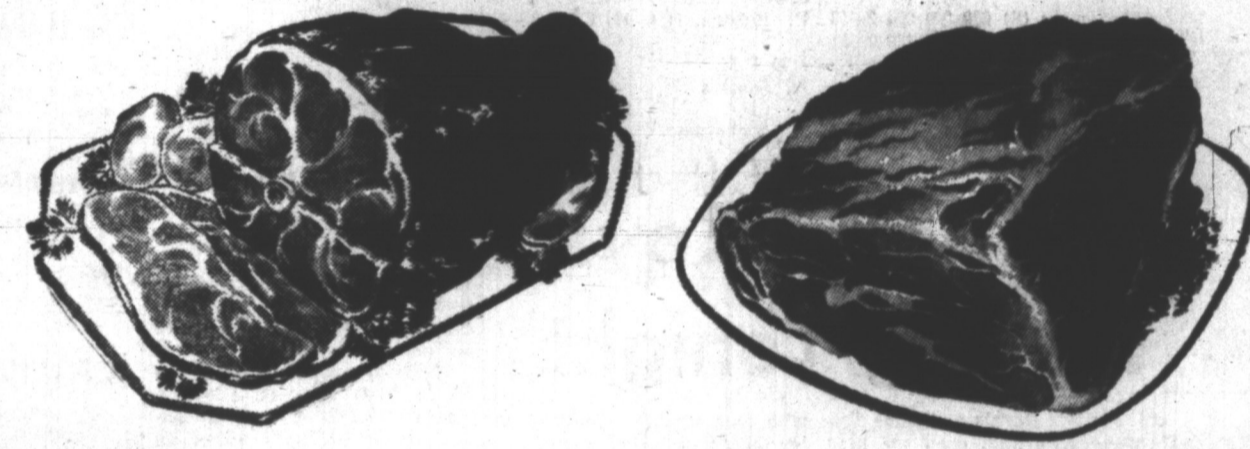
