Dave Lucas Top Athlete At Track Meet: Jimmy Fardy Wins 10-Mile Bicycle Race

Dave Lucas, a track and field artist from Annapolis Valley, won the individual award for the best all-round athletic performance at the Maritime Invitational Track and Field Meet held at Memorial Field in Charlottetown yesterday afternoon.

A Charlottetown boy, Jimmy Fardy, won the ten mile bike race finishing about one half mile ahead of his closest rival, Windsor Arsenault of Summerside. Kenny Ford also of Charlottetown, held down third position. The time of the event was 31 mins and 4 seconds and all of the six cyclists who started finished.

Lucas won the 100 yard dash, the hop, step and jump and the running broad jump to amass his total of fifteen points, five more than three of his rivals all tied in second place with ten.

The ten mile road race was won by George Gallant of Dupuis, N. B., who finished the gruelling run with hardly a trace of fatigue as he sprinted the last 220 yards to the tape 64 minutes and 52 seconds after the starting gun. Gallant overtook second place finisher, Joe Richard of Lancaster, N.B., who was well in the lead when the runners arrived to finish the last mile on the cinder track at Memorial Field.

Hans Schatz of Miramichi, N.B., finished in third place while Rocky MacInnis of Southport and John Paul, well known marathon runner for the Abbies, finished fourth and fifth respectively.
