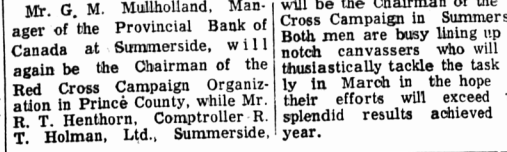

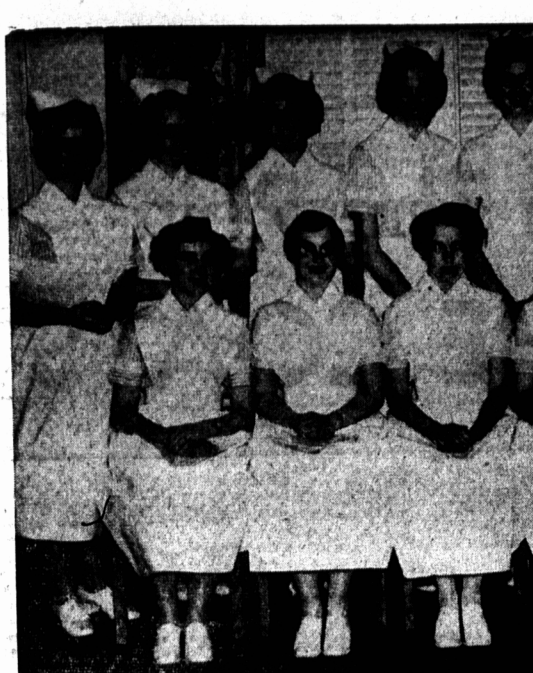

Timely Notes on Fur Topics

The 15th. annual meeting of the Great Lakes Mink Association featured a discussion on the impact of EMBTA's soon to be introduced mutation Diadem on the fur market. The meeting was held Feb. 23 at the Plankinton House. Leaders in the genetics discussion were Prof. Richard M. Shackelford, University of Wisconsin, who analysed the genetic implications of the latest mink mutations, and Marc Spaulder of Russeks Wholesale, who shed light on the manufacturer's point of view. These addresses were followed by a question and answer panel discussion which was taken part in by various animal and mink ranchers. In conjunction with the Diadem talks a series of slides were used for demonstration purposes. Several dressed pelts in red, yellow, and blue were displayed by Prof. Shackelford. Other subjects taken up were advertising, buying service, marketing research and Great Lakes Mink Association's ranch service. Another panel discussion was on the whelping problems of Dr. Hartsough and other experts.
