Ottawa's Woman Mayor Reported Keen On Tradition

OTTAWA, Oct. 6—(CP) — Ottawa's first woman Mayor, Charlotte Whitton, is looking to her formal inauguration Oct. 15 with an historian's eye on tradition and a feminine eye on housekeeping.

One of her first actions on succeeding the late Mayor Grenville Goodwin was to order the refurbishing of an old, throne-like hand-carved wooden chair formerly used by Ottawa mayors.

The chair has been gathering dust in a local fire station since the capital's city hall burned down 20 years ago. It is being placed in the public school administration building where city council now meets.

Dr. Whitton also took a tip from the Lord Mayor of London, Sir Denys Lawson, who recently visited Ottawa and secured his chains of office with gold shoulder clips. She has had similar clips fitted to her own clothing.
