Attempts To Develop Fail

BRANTFORD (CUP)---Alma Green, a 78 year old Mohawk clan mother, confirmed reports of a secret ceremony held here earlier this month. She said an Indian medicine woman renewed for another year a curse first placed on former Indian land in 1904.

The land, presently a parking lot one square block in size, was sold by the Indians to the city in the late 1800's on the understanding it would be used for an open agricultural market. Subsequent city attempts to develop the land for other uses angered the Indians who

invoked a curse bringing misfortune to anyone who attempts construction of the land. Attempts to develop the land have failed repeatedly during the past decades and a Toronto developer who has plans for the piece of ground is now encountering difficulty obtaining mortgage money.

Green said she was eight years old when she first witnessed the curse invocation ceremony. She remembers seeing then an old medicine woman hobbling around on a cane and murmuring magic words to call forth the spirits
