One Time Heroin Courier Claims Help Was Promised

HARTFORD, Conn. (AP)—A one-time courier for an international heroin smuggling ring said in federal court here he was promised help in getting a presidential pardon by an assistant U.S. attorney for his services as a government witness.

Joseph M. Caron of Montreal, now serving a 10-year sentence, made this statement under cross-examination by Percy Foreman, chief defence counsel for James J. Miller, 38, of Orange, who is being tried for allegedly conspiring as a member of the dope ring.

Caron said he discussed the question of a commutation of sentence two or three weeks ago in the Galveston, Tex. jail with Assistant U.S. Attorney William Butler, now serving as special prosecutor at the Miller trial.

The witness said he told Butler of his intention to apply to the pardon attorney in Washington for executive clemency. "He told me he was going to back me up," said Caron.

"Has he told you on one or more occasions he would back you up in consideration of your testimony?" Foreman asked. "A couple of times."

PROMISED SUPPORT
Caron said Butler had not guaranteed him anything but had merely promised to support him in his attempt to get a pardon.

Caron was arrested at the Mexican border in Laredo, Tex., Oct. 10, 1963, driving a car carrying 76 pounds of heroin he said was destined for delivery in Stratford, Conn.
