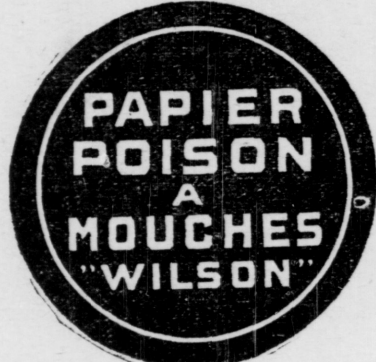
PERSONNEL

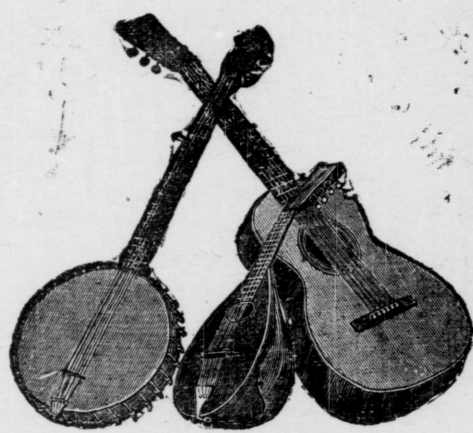

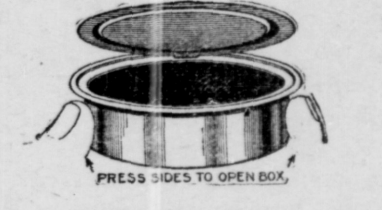
